MISSION OF THE PROGRAM

The Mental Health Worker certificate program and associate's degree prepares students to enter the workforce as a paraprofessional in community-based mental health programs. Students will be trained in psychosocial rehabilitation and recovery paradigm.

The recovery based training program was established at Cerritos College to meet a need in the community for well trained mental health professionals.



JOB OUTLOOK

Employment of behavioral disorder and mental health counselors is projected to grow 22 percent from 2021 to 2031, much faster than the average for all occupations. There are roughly 43,600 openings for substance abuse, behavioral disorder, and mental health workers each year, on average, and in 2021, the median pay was \$48,250.
