A homeless student is without a place to live, often residing in a shelter, an automobile, an abandoned building or outside.

A student facing housing insecurity may be unable to pay rent or utilities, or may need to move frequently.









What We Know

55% of our students experience housing insecurity.

15% of our students experience homelessness.

Our students have a higher rate of housing insecurity than students attending nearby community colleges.

Only 6% of students who experience homelessness receive housing assistance.

• Jovenes' staff at The Village includes a Case Manager, Program Assistant, and an On-Site Manager who lives at The Village.


