- 4 Title 5, Section 55061:
- 5 ACCJC Accreditation Standard II.A (formerly II.A.3)
- 6 Each Associate Degree offered by the College shall be published in the College Catalog.
- 7 Further, the purpose of the degrees and their requirements shall be explained in the
- 8 catalog. Each degree will contain a pattern of general education and major courses and
- 9 will lead students through patterns of learning that develop capabilities and insight
- including communication, mathematical calculations, modes of inquiry, awareness of
- culture and times, ethical considerations, and self understanding. The programs of the
- 12 College are consistent with the institutional mission, purposes, demographics, and
- economics of its community.
- 14 Associate degrees shall be submitted through the following procedure:
- Department proposing the degree shall complete all forms required in the approval process to the dean for approval or non approval;
- If the degree is career/technical in nature, the dean will present it to the regional consortium for approval;
 - The proposal shall be forwarded to the Curriculum Committee;
- If approved by the Curriculum Committee, the degree is submitted to the Board of
 Trustees for approval; and
 - The degree will be forwarded to the State Chancellor's Office for approval. If approved, the degree will be offered to students and published in the catalog.
- The philosophy of general education coursework as created by the Curriculum Committee and approved by the Faculty Senate, shall be published in the College Catalog. Courses
- 26 approved by the Curriculum Committee for inclusion into the general education
- 27 requirements shall be evaluated by the Curriculum Committee as meeting this philosophy
- as well as the criteria for approval of general education coursework. Coursework shall
- be approved which additionally introduces students to the variety of means through which
- 30 people comprehend the modern world. Content will introduce the student to major areas
- of knowledge and provides an opportunity for students to develop intellectual skills,

- 32 technological literacy, affective and creative capabilities, social attitudes, and an
- appreciation for cultural diversity.
- Courses submitted for general education shall be approved as a separate action by the
- 35 Curriculum Committee if they meet the criteria outlined in the preceding paragraphs.
