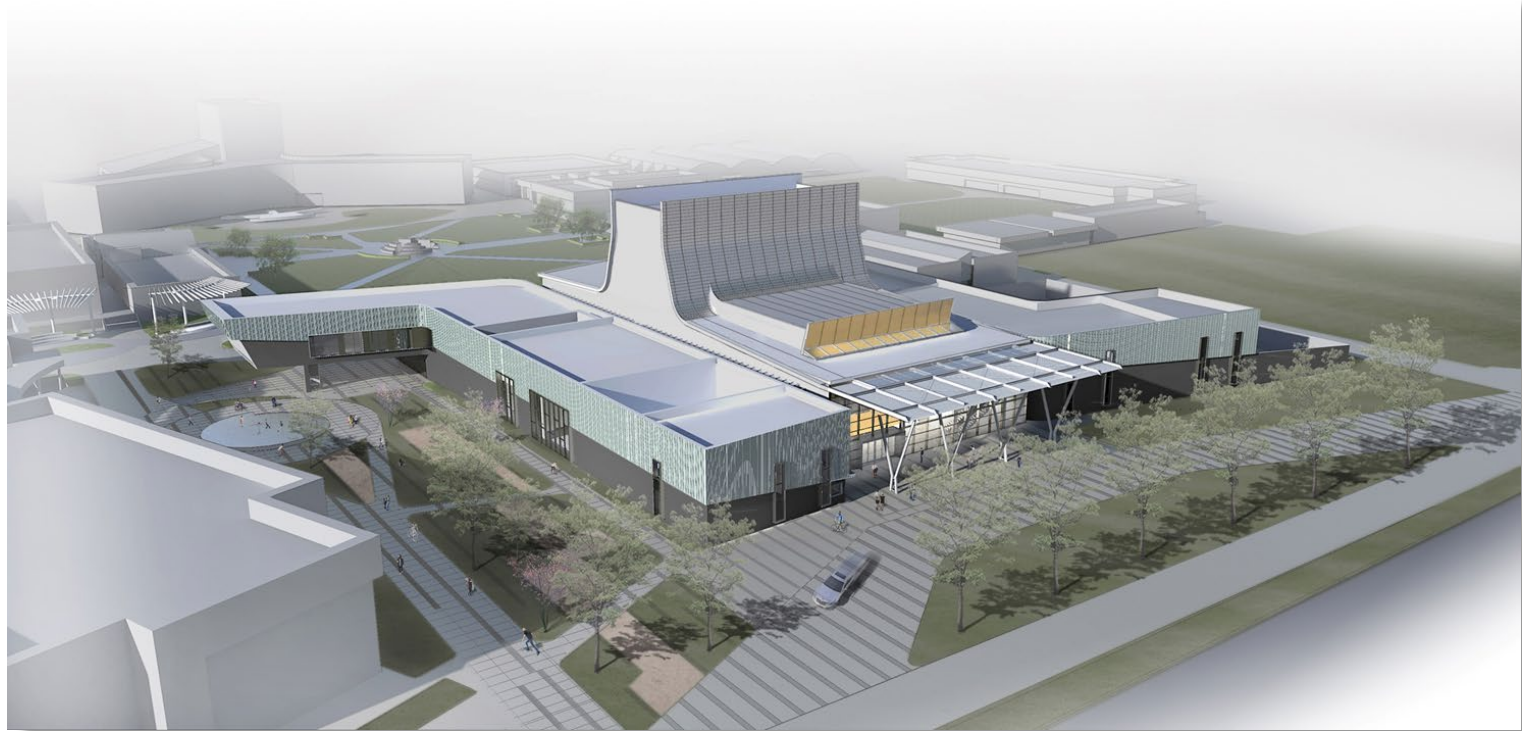

Student Centered: Academic Partnerships

- **The President Scholars Academy:** Beginning in 11th grade, students earn a total of **24.5 college units** upon completion of the program.
- **College and Career Access Pathway (CCAP) Agreements:** In the 2018-2019 school year, **531** K-12 students took college courses at their high schools
- **Early College Program:** High school students will complete **55 general education college units for the CSU/UC systems**, beginning in the 9th grade.

Student Centered: Economic Development

Cerritos College partners with companies to upskill their employees on-site, and tailor training content based on specific need.

Over the past year, we served 972 participants and 31 companies and organizations.

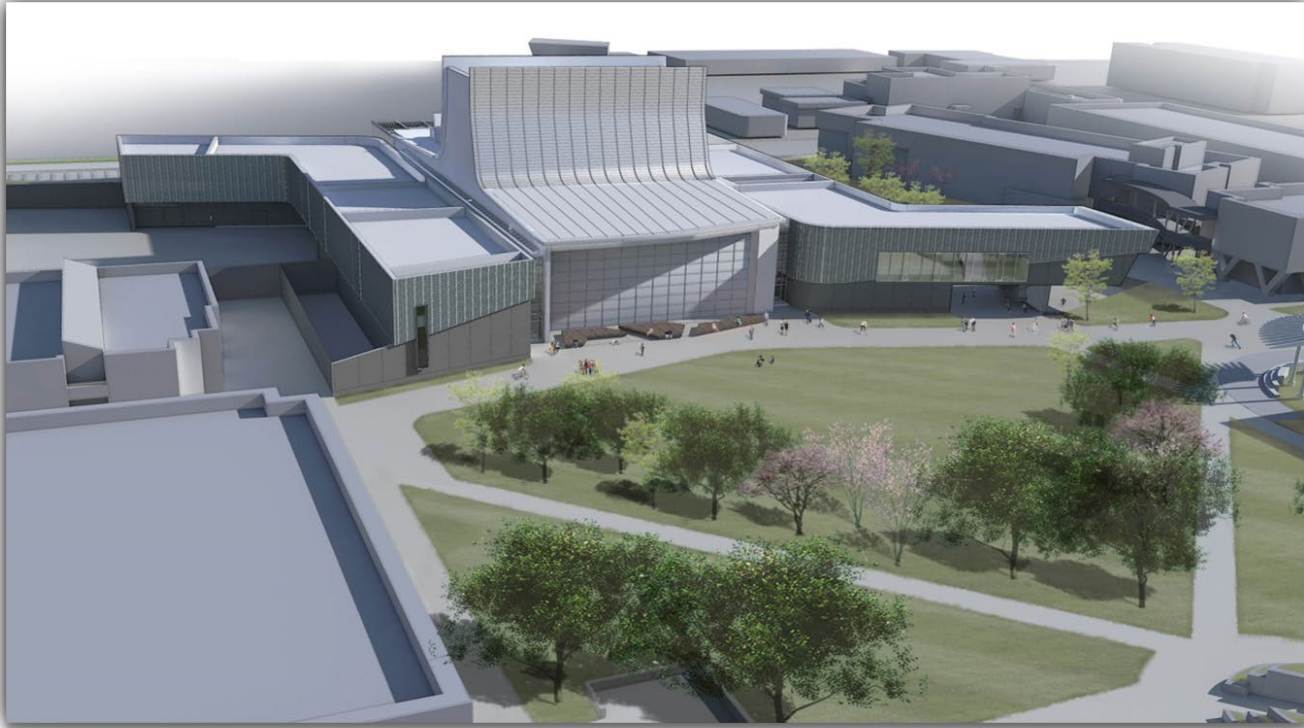

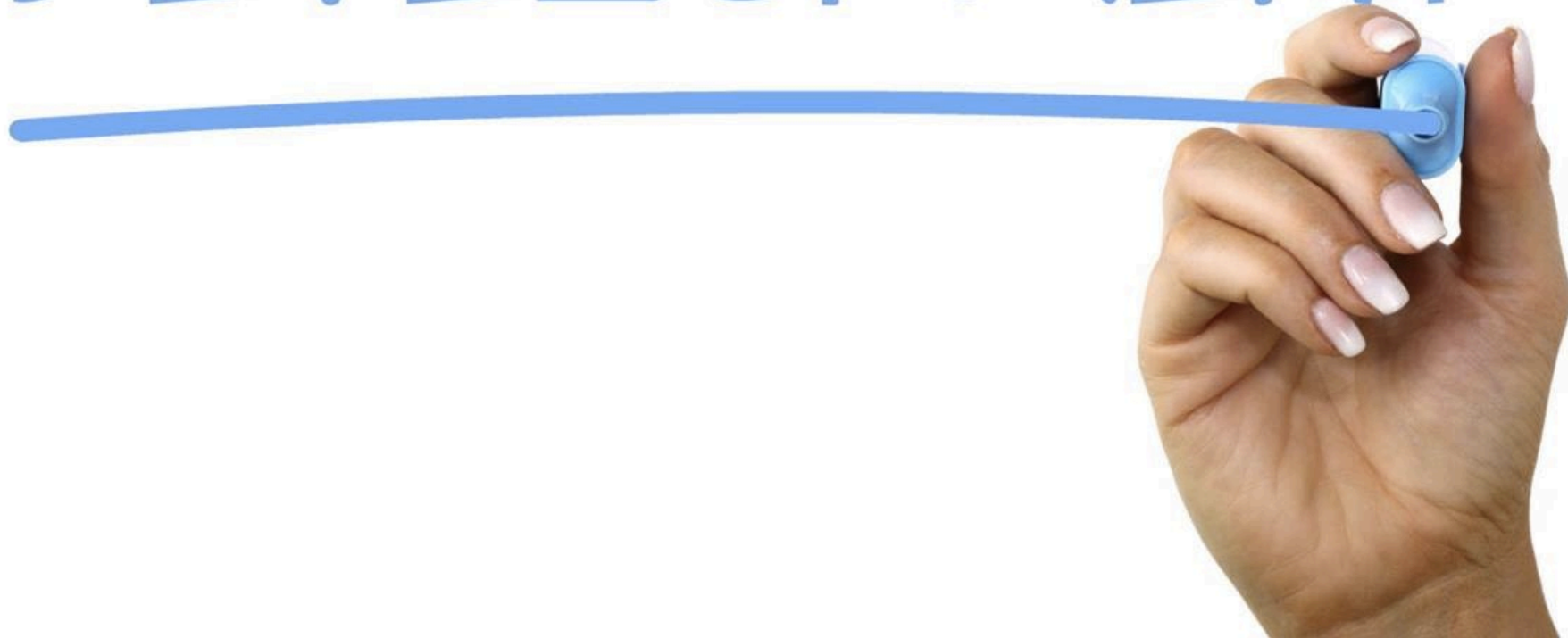

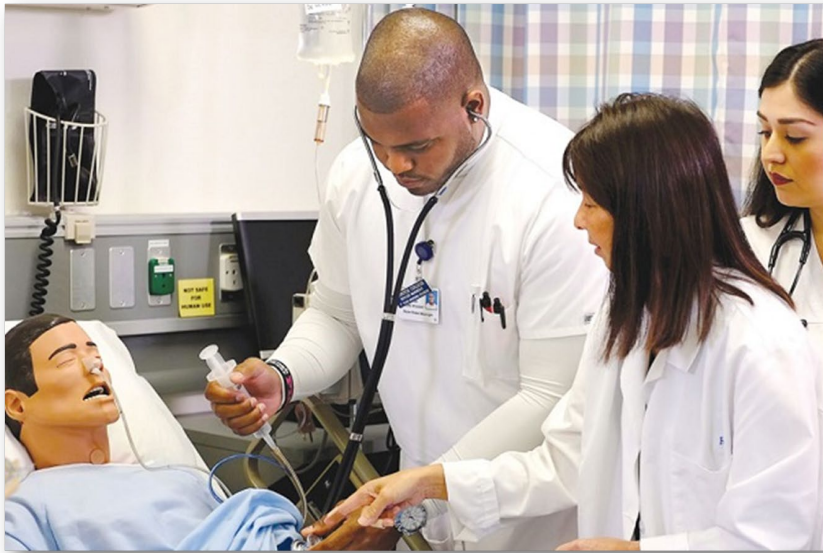


An Economic Engine

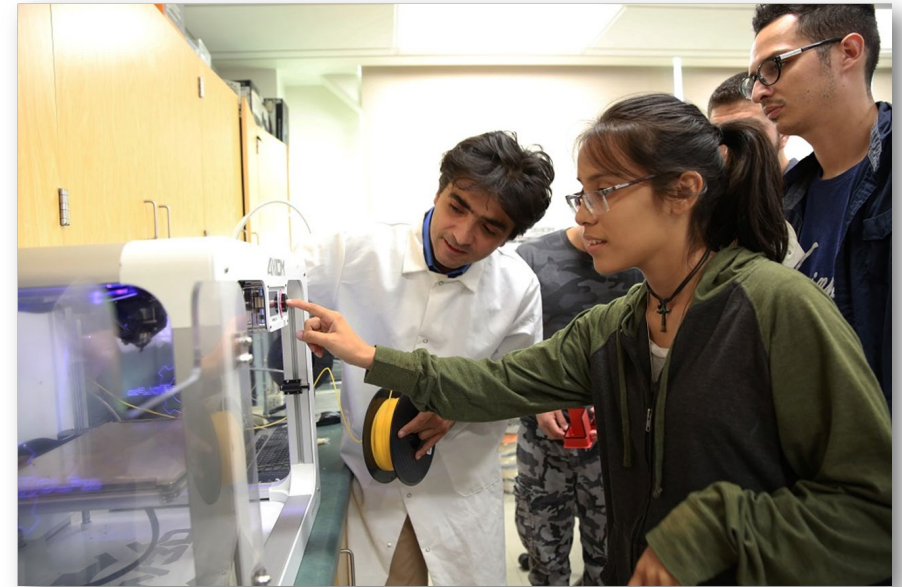
