7. Lottery to Stagger Terms of FPDC Members

- a. The Faculty Senate is requesting its committees, including the FPDC, to stagger the terms of their members
- b. The goal is to help preserve the institutional memory of each committee by eliminating the possibility of all its members being replaced at once
- c. Half of the committee members' terms would be for one year (2020-2021) and half would be for two years (2020-2022)
- d. The members whose one-year terms would expire at the end of this year could then be re-elected to serve full two-year terms (2021-2023)
- e. The senate is asking that committees stagger the terms by lottery
- f. Monique Valencia made a motion to approve the proposal to stagger the FPDC members' terms by lottery at the committee's meeting on October 13, specifying that the "lottery" would consist of drawing names out of a hat. Joana Mootz-Gonzales seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously by the committee members present.
