Fall Admissions Only. There will be no mid-year admissions. Applicants interested in the Theater major must choose one of the following elective sequences on the UC Application: Acting, Design/Production, Directing, General Theater Studies, Musical Theater, or Playwriting. Admission requirements include required supplemental materials such as a departmental questionnaire, personal statement, copies of transcripts, resume of theater training, and audition/interview. All applicants must meet the admissions standards of UCLA and the departmental screening process. There will also be a fee for all auditions/interviews. Applicants may submit materials for consideration in one or more of the following areas: acting, design and production, directing, history and criticism, musical theatre, and playwriting. Applicants to the school must have a minimum 3.2 GPA at the time of application and must complete their general education course work prior to entrance.
