Isabel Allende Tells Her Story Podcast/Discussion

Isabel Allende—novelist, feminist, and philanthropist—is one of the most widely-read authors in the world, having sold more than 77 million books.

Chilean born in Peru, Isabel won worldwide acclaim in 1982 with the publication of her first novel, *The House of the Spirits*, which began as a letter to her dying grandfather. She has authored more than twenty-six bestselling books that have been translated into more than forty-two languages.

Allende devotes much of her time to human rights causes. Following the death of her daughter Paula, she established a charitable foundation in her honor, which has awarded grants to more than 100 nonprofits worldwide, delivering life-changing care to hundreds of thousands of women and girls.
