1 AP 4255 DISMISSAL AND READMISSION

- 3 Title 5, Sections 55033 and 55034
- 4 After the end of the third semester in which the student is on academic or progress
- 5 probation, a notice of dismissal will be sent to the student.
- 6 **Notice of Dismissal:** The notice of dismissal will cover, at a minimum, an explanation
- of what dismissal means, the procedure to appeal the dismissal, and the procedure for
- 8 readmission.
- 9 Appeal of Dismissal: The student has the right to appeal a proposed dismissal action if
- the student feels that facts exist that warrant an exception to the dismissal action. The
- student must file the written petition of appeal in the Office of Admissions and Records
- within 30 days after the dismissal notice was sent. If the student fails to file a written
- petition within the 30 days, the student waives all future rights to appeal the dismissal. It
- is the student's responsibility to indicate on the petition a clear statement of the grounds
- on which continued enrollment should be granted and to provide evidence supporting the
- reasons. Petitions will be reviewed by the Academic Records and Standards Committee.
- 17 The student will be continued on probation until the Academic Records and Standards
- 18 Committee decides on the student's appeal.
- 19 The decision of the Academic Records and Standards Committee will be communicated
- to the student in writing and is final.
- 21 If the dismissal appeal is granted, the student will be continued on probation for an
- 22 additional semester. At the end of the additional semester, the student's academic record
- will again be evaluated to determine whether the student may be removed from probation,
- should be dismissed, or should be continued on probation.
- 25 Standards for Evaluating Appeals: Dismissal appeals may be granted under the
- 26 following circumstances:
- If the dismissal determination is based on the academic record for one semester
- in which the record does not reflect the student's usual level of performance due
- to accident, illness, or other circumstances beyond the control of the student.
- Verification should be submitted with the appeal.

- The student enrolls in a corrective program designed to assist him/her in improving academic skills, such as obtaining academic counseling, and/or limiting course load.
 - There is evidence of significant improvement in academic achievement.
- Readmission after Dismissal: In considering whether or not students may be readmitted after a dismissal and at least one semester's absence from Cerritos College, the following criteria should be considered:
 - Documented extenuating circumstances (considered during appeal).
 - Marked improvement between the semesters on which disqualification was based.
 - Semesters on which disqualification was based were atypical of past academic performance.
 - Formal or informal educational experiences since completion of semesters on which disqualification was based.
 - Improved GPA as a result of grade changes, fulfillment of incomplete courses, or academic renewal.
