Our beloved **Nancy Kelly** passed away on Sunday, August 17, while surrounded by loved ones. In her honor, a celebration of her life was held on Saturday, August 30 at 10:00 a.m. at the Cerritos College Nancy Kelly Softball Field.

"Once a Falcon, always a Falcon."

This mantra was not only coined and fulfilled by Cerritos College's first-ever softball and women's basketball coach Nancy Kelly, it continues on through the program's current staff and players.

Kelly, a Cerritos College Hall of Famer and softball field namesake, died Sunday at the age of 78 after a battle with cancer. Her presence and ability to mentor was felt throughout the program long after her coaching days, even up to last season, where she could be found in attendance regularly as a fan and team supporter.

In addition to her on-field contributions and later support, Kelly created a scholarship which was to go to one student -athlete per year to help pay for books, with the hope that the student would continue her academic career, whether she went on to play softball at a four-year institution or not. Ruth was born September 2, 1923 on a farm in Granite Township near Pierz, Minnesota, to Tom and Gertrude (Nohner) Feucht. After graduating from Little Falls High School in 1941, Ruth attended Teacher Training School and taught in one-room schoolhouses at Bowlus and Genola,

In 1944 she served in the US Navy as a Wave and was stationed at the Naval Supply Depot in Philadelphia. Following World War II, Ruth attended Iowa State University where she graduated with a B.S. in Home Economics. She later became an Associate College Professor.



When I came to, my glasses were smashed on the ground, I seemed to be bleeding, but I saw another truck stopped in the street. The man in that truck saw the attack and told me that he had written down the driver's license number. Later I learned that a woman leaving the store parking lot across the street had witnessed the attack also. Campus Police arrived, but the Officer seemed very angry, apparently thinking I had done something wrong. But then my "angel" arrived - Keith Adams!
