Distinguished Female Athlete Track and Field

April Brown


s a sprinter on the Cerritos College track and field team from 2002-03, April Brown set and broke her own record in the 100-meter and 200-meter numerous times. She went on to win the state championship in the 100-meter both years, while she won the state title in the 200-meter as a sophomore. April is the only sprinter in Falcon history to win the state championship in either event. Additionally, she ran the second leg of the 400-meter relay team that won the state title in 2003. Her times of 11.41 in the 100-meter and 23.91 in the 200-meter were school records until 2013, and she ran a leg of the top three times in school history in the 400-meter relay and is part of the third-fastest 1600-meter relay time in Cerritos history. She transferred to Cal State Los Angeles and won the 2006 NCAA Division II 60-meter Indoor National Championship with an NCAA Championship record time of 7.43. After graduation, April earned a bachelor's degree and is currently working in the medical field.



Distinguished Male Athlete Basketball Lovenzo Roman



rom 1976-78, Lorenzo Romar was a men's basketball player and earned All-South Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore at Cerritos College. He was recruited to play at the University of Washington before being drafted by the Golden State Warriors in the NBA and had a five-year professional career that saw him play for three teams. Lorenzo then embarked on his coaching career after a stint playing and coaching for Athletes in Action. While still playing and early on in his coaching career, he was regularly the keynote speaker at the Cerritos men's basketball banquets and was readily available to the program to provide insight and guidance for the student-athletes. He then served as an assistant coach on the 1995 NCAA National Championship team at UCLA and has since gone on to serve as the head coach at Pepperdine University, Saint Louis University and is currently in his 15th season as the head coach at the University of Washington and has a 289-174 record. Spanning 20 seasons, Lorenzo has a career head coaching record of 382-189 and has guided his Huskies teams to three Sweet 16 appearances and nine post-season appearances. He was also named the PAC-10 Coach of the Year twice, as well as the PAC-12 Coach of the Year in 2012.





Distinguished Coach Wrestling

Jeff Smith

fter spending 21 years as the Cerritos College wrestling coach, Jeff Smith spent seven years as the department's Athletic Director before retiring in 2008. In his time as the wrestling coach, Jeff led the Falcons to 12 South Coast Conference championships, as well as one State Championship (1995) and two dual meet state championships. Prior to winning the state championship, his teams had finished in second place at the state championships for three straight seasons. During his tenure as the Falcons head coach, Jeff posted a 212-32-2 record, coached 22 individual state champions during his tenure, 75 All-Americans, while his teams also won seven Southern California championships. As a collegiate wrestler, Jeff was a State Champion and All-American for the Falcons during the 1966-67 season while posting a 65-4 record on the mat. He then moved onto Michigan State University where he went 50-2, was a two-time Big Ten Champion and named the conference's Most Outstanding Wrestler. Also a two-time All-American, Jeff went



on to win national titles in Freestyle and Greco Roman styles of wrestling and was a four-time USA Wrestling All-American. He was also Pan American Games gold medal winner in free style wrestling and was an alternate on the 1972 Olympic Team.

Distinguished Alumnus Class of 1969

Patrick Schwerdtfeger



ecognized as one of the most successful community college forensic coaches in the state and nation, Patrick Schwerdtfeger began his illustrious career at Cerritos College where he developed an aptitude for competitive debating. Pat's notable accomplishments on the forensic team while at Cerritos included securing a first place win at the Phi Rho Pi Nationals, and multiple awards at the State Championship level including distinction as first place in Extemporaneous speaking, an impromptu speaking finalist, and second place in debate. Pat also participated in student government at Cerritos College, receiving a Silver Falcon award for his service.

After earning his bachelor's and master's degrees, Pat shared his craft and knowledge with students at Palomar College for 33 years. He then promoted through the college administrator ranks, serving as Vice President of Academic Affairs at Riverside City College in 2007. Although retired since 2011, Pat continues to contribute to community colleges both in- and out-of-state in interim positions. In fall of 2011, Cerritos College was privileged to welcome an alumnus in an administrator position when Pat served as interim Dean of Technology, and Liberal Arts.



Distinguished Faculty Speech Communications Donna Miller



onna Miller began her teaching career at Cerritos College in 1972, as the Director of Forensics. During her 38-year tenure, she served as professor, department chairperson, and instructional dean of Liberal Arts, interim Executive Dean of Community, Industry, and Technology Education, and interim Vice President of Academic Affairs. Donna served on numerous faculty committees including president of the Cerritos College Faculty Association, and was recognized with the Outstanding Faculty Senator award. She twice chaired the Cerritos College accreditation process, and was responsible for chairing the committee that authored the original shared governance policy. Along with her on campus leadership roles, Donna served off campus as president of the National Community College Forensics Association, and directed both the National and California Forensics Tournaments.

Donna was instrumental in helping the Speech Communications department create one of the most extensive curriculum offerings in the state. Under her direction, the speech and debate team won numerous state and national awards by ensuring that her teams were always thoroughly prepared for competition. Donna was an exceptional teacher who touched the lives of many students. She truly exemplified excellence in teaching and was highly respected by her peers and students as reflected in twice being awarded the Outstanding Faculty commendation.

In addition to her dedication to serving Cerritos College, Donna also served for 20 years as an elected trustee of the Buena Park Library District, and 19 years as a trustee on the North Orange County Community College District Board of Trustees.



Since her retirement in 2010, she remains committed to the success of California's community colleges by making presentations to local and statewide organizations, as well as at community colleges including Cerritos College's Board of Trustees meetings, and the Falcon Leadership Academy. Donna is also an active member of the Cerritos College Retired Faculty Association.



Professor Emeritus of Automotive Technology





ired on April 11, 1957 as one of Cerritos College's original faculty members, John Jackson played a key role in the development and transformation of our Automotive Technology program.

Throughout his 34-year tenure, John worked tirelessly to advance the program, cultivated key relationships with industry experts, and established long-term partnerships with major automotive conglomerates, many of which are still in place today.

In collaboration with colleagues, John developed new curriculum to keep students in front of industry changes. He was instrumental in procuring and implementing training programs with General Motors, Chrysler, and Ford providing students with highly marketable experience in the workplace. His efforts did not end once students graduated. He put in place partnerships with companies to provide students with valuable connections in the automotive field, including opportunities to secure paid internships and employment, and for instructors to enhance their skills with the latest technology. John was an exceptional teacher who touched the lives of many students.

John witnessed many changes in the automotive program during his time at Cerritos College – from the holding of classes in a residential garage and at Artesia High School, to the comprehensive state-of-the-art facility it is today. 


