Skating since she was five years old, Caroline began her season by winning the silver medal at her regional championship to qualify for the 2003 U.S. Junior Championships where she took 4th place. Born in Boston to parents from Wuhan, China, she is bilingual in English and Mandarin. Caroline moved to California at a young age with her parents and older sister Yang Yang. Since then is a two-time (2010 and 2012) Four Continents bronze medalist, the 2007 World Junior Champion, the 2006 Junior Grand Prix Final champion, and a three-time U.S. National Medalist (2009-bronze, 2008 and 2012-pewter). Caroline's signature move is the Pearl Spin, coined by her mother, a layback spin in the Biellmann position. A pianist and violinist, she trained in ballet before switching to figure skating. Engaged to figure skate Grant Hochstein, Caroline has been studying Psychology and Business Marketing at Cerritos College since 2016.

Eric Rhoden





Distinguished Coach Basketball

ROBERT FOERSTER

or 11 seasons (1971-82), Bob Foerster served as the Cerritos College men's basketball coach. During his tenure, Bob led his teams to a 209-118 record and three conference championships (1973, 1975 and 1980), was named the conference's Coach of the Year four time and the State Coach of the Year in 1975. He was known for his exemplary work in the classroom, as well as on the basketball coach with his organizational skills, coupled with his affable personality. In 1982, Bob came down with a disease that left him physically impaired and unable to no longer run the men's program. He was asked by new women's head coach Karen Welliver to serve on her staff in 1983. Required to use a walker to get around, Bob never let his illness keep him from anything related to coaching. His strength resonated with the women's team and the following year, they won their first conference championship in the program's history and reached the state semifinals. Bob remains active and serves as an inspiration to anyone who has been slowed by a disability.




Distinguished Male Athlete Basketball

WILLIE JOSEPH

uring the peak of the LA Lakers "Showtime", led by Magic Johnson, Cerritos College had their own version of Johnson. For two seasons (1985-87), Willie Joseph provided as much excitement for the fans with his up-tempo style of play and high-flying dunks. Willie led the Falcons to two South Coast Conference championships and still ranks second on the school's all-time scoring list. His ability to cut through defenses and score points in bunches is one of the main reasons the Cerritos teams combined for a 57-8 record in his two seasons and earned him a pair of 1st Team All-SCC selections, as well as All-State recognition. In his freshman year, Willie averaged 17 points a game, shot 54% from the field and followed that with a 22.7 points-per-game sophomore season and left him tied for second place in school history for most points in a season (749). Known for his consistent play, Willie recorded only three 30-point games in his career and shot over 54% from the field both seasons. He received a scholarship to New Mexico State University, where he was a two-year starter. Willie is currently a Youth Participation Officer in Tasmania, Australia and coaches youth basketball.

Distinguished Faculty Speech Communications

WENDELL HANKS

endell Hanks joined the Speech Department faculty in September 1966. His innovative approach brought new dimensions to the teaching of speech. He emphasized overcoming shyness and enjoyed watching his students attain this goal. A lecturer on education for college and community groups, Wendell was active on a variety of campus committees and produced workshops for campus staff, management, and other college groups.

During his tenure, he served as the director of the national championship speech team. Coincidentally, his father's Marshall High School debate team and the Cerritos College team both won national championships in 1970, the only time father/son coaches have won debate championships the same year. Wendell was a faculty member who was highly revered by students, faculty, staff and administrators as reflected in twice being awarded the Outstanding Faculty commendation. In addition, he produced, promoted and directed over 100 events on campus and in the community, and was a moving force behind some of the great and memorable nights of entertainment at the college.

Since his retirement in May 2011, Wendell has been active member of the Cerritos College Retired Faculty Association and serves a director for the Fullerton Train Museum. Also, he is an active volunteer for the Railroad Operations Committee restoration team.



Distinguished Female Athlete Softball

SAMIE (GARCIA) ZUIDEMA

ecording one of the most successful seasons in the college's softball history, Samie Garcia is at or near the top of multiple categories based on her 2010 season. She set a school record with a .519 batting average and 10 triples, while she stole 29 bases and drew 23 walks. She went 69-for-133 at the plate and drove in 34 runs for the Falcons, who went 39-6 on the season and won the South Coast Conference title. For her efforts, Samie was recognized as the National Player of the Year, as well as State Player of the Year, Southern California Player of the Year, SCC Player of the Year and earned All-American honors. Samie transferred to the University of South Carolina after her freshman season and went on to earn to be named Easton All-America 1st Team, Coaches All-Southeastern Conference 2nd Team, CollegeSportsMadness.com All-SEC 2nd Team and was named to the SEC Spring Academic Honor Roll as a senior. She was an All-SEC 2nd Team pick her junior year, as well as being named to the Academic Honor Roll. For her three-year career at the University of South Caroline, Samie's name is peppered throughout their single-season a career record book. She led her team in multiple categories each season and finished her career with a .364 batting average, which ranks third overall in school history. At the conclusion of her collegiate career, Samie was drafted 13th overall by the New York/New Jersey Comets of the National Pro Fastpitch League in 2013 also played for the Pennsylvania Rebellion. Samie is currently working as a oneon-one aide at Midland Park High School in New Jersey and continues to provide softball lessons to young athletes.


