- 4. Considering: Academic Calendar and Total Number of Contractual Days (Goals A-D)

    - 2. Reducing total hours of FLEX

  - a. Senate Survey
    - i. 91% 10-month faculty responded
    - ii. 47.2% 171 days with 24 hours of Flex 2 academic days would be removed from the academic year
    - iii. 40.6% 173 days with 12 hours of Flex no change to academic days
    - iv. 7.5% No opinion

## b. Discussion:

- i. Joana Think about students and the responsibilities of this committee and faculty at large. How does this honor our responsibilities to conduct professional development? 11-12 month employee are remained the same need to work the entire year.
- ii. Frank Faculty instructional contract is separate from 11-12 month employees. They need to discuss it with their contracts. Frank would like to take random two days, days depends on faculty.
- iii. Kaitlin Scott Having an extra two days would be beneficial to allow us to take more time for training and would not impact services
- iv. Joana Does 16-week calendar affect the final decision. Lydia, The contractual days will be renegotiated with the Calendar committee.
- v. Valeria Keeping the Flex hours will help us with Goal A.
- vi. Frank CTE need to complete PD hours anyways to stay concurrent. Valeria, agreed that faculty in CTEs + HO have to stay current with licenses, so no what they need to complete the 25 + more.
- vii. Lydia adjusting flex hours will affect Goal C & D will be impacted. David, decreasing the number of flex hours will make it more difficult to complete the goals.
- viii. David State Guidelines highlight to allow as much flexibility for faculty to complete PD. It highly recommends to not create required flex days.
- ix. Frank There is not enough data/information to for this committee to make a proposal.
- x. David The CCFF has already made a decision and are moving forward. How is that decision going to this committee and professional development for Faculty.
- xi. Joana is this decision for 2022-2023 academic year?

- xii. Lydia Academic is set for the next 3 years. Academic Calendar is going to make a decision for the next 3 years.
- c. David making a motion of a recommendation To continue with 24 hours and work towards adjusting the academic calendar by 2 days. To support the goals of this committee and to make professional development accessible to faculty. Kaitlin Suggestion. Joanna second 8 approved, 1 abstain David requests that reps ask at division meetings how faculty would like to proceed.
