#### About the Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) Program

The Pharm.D. is earned through a three-year, accelerated professional degree program consisting of eight, 15-week trimesters delivered year-round.

- Apple technology and electronic access to textbooks included in tuition
- Delivery of much of the curriculum utilizing small groups and team-based learning

### **What You Can Expect**

- You will focus on the lifelong pursuit of answers to the grand challenges in human health and your role in the delivery of those solutions.
- You will receive a Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) professional degree that
  prepares you for licensure to practice pharmacy in a wide range of settings. You
  may also choose to continue your studies in advanced practice specialization or
  research.
- You will learn through a unique "flipped classroom" approach where you
  acquire basic knowledge outside class and apply that knowledge to real cases
  and problems in class with expert faculty help.
- You will learn alongside physician assistant, nursing, physical therapy and other health profession students.
- You will participate in inter-professional experiences in simulated patient care environments that will allow you to work on communication, leadership and team building.

#### **Admissions Requirements**

To be considered for admission, the applicant must meet the following requirements:

- Completion of the 62 semester units of prerequisite courses at an accredited institution
- Letter grade of C or higher for all prerequisite courses
- Preferred applicants have an overall and prerequisite GPA of 3.0 or higher
- PCAT is optional but highly recommended. Preferred applicants will have a PCAT composite percentile score of 50 or higher
- Two Letters of Recommendation
- Meet and comply with School of Pharmacy Technical Standards
- A criminal background check, drug screening and up-to-date immunization record will be required for all applicants offered admission
