



What is BSR?

The Basic Skills Requirement (BSR) is required by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing for anyone seeking a teaching credential. By satisfying the BSR, applicants demonstrate basic skills proficiency in the areas of reading, writing, and math.

Who needs to Satisfy BSR?

The requirement applies to those seeking a credential, certificate, or permit needed to serve in public schools. Some institutions may require the basic skills requirement prior to credential program enrollment.

When will students need to satisfy BSR?

Students will need to contact their advisor at the university (after transfer).

There are several ways to complete the **BSR** Requirement. Your options are listed below:

Earn a B or higher in qualifying coursework.

Use a combination of qualifying score on exams + coursework.

Pass the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST).

CSET: Multiple Subject AND the CSET: Writing Skills Exam.

SAT or ACT Scores for English and Math.

College Board Advanced Placements (AP) Exams.


CSU Early Assessment Program (EAP).

CSU Placement Exams (EPT and ELM).

Qualifying Coursework at Cerritos College:

Qualifying college-level coursework may be used to satisfy the Basic Skills Requirement **once you transfer to the university**. The courses must be verified by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing or a Commission-approved preparation programs. Cerritos College does not issue credentials. Therefore, the verification of Basic Skills Requirement will be completed at the university level.

<u>In order for coursework to be considered, it must meet the following criteria:</u>

- Completed with a grade of "B" or better
- Completed at a Regionally Accredited institution (ex. Cerritos College)
- Must be a 3 semester unit or 4 quarter unit course (Cerritos College follows a semester academic calendar)
- For **Reading**: must be in the subject of critical thinking, literature, philosophy, reading, rhetoric, or textual analysis
- For **Writing**: must be in the subject of composition, English, rhetoric, written communications, or writing
- For **Mathematics**: must be in the subject of algebra, geometry, mathematics, quantitative reasoning, or statistics

GUIDE TO VERIFYING COURSEWORK FOR BSR

This guide could serve as verification that the content in the course(s) you completed from a regionally accredited institution can satisfy the Basic Skills Requirement (BSR).

The following is the California Teaching Credentialing criteria for coursework that can satisfy the BSR:

Must have earned a "B-" or better (Pass/Credit acceptable if institution does not issue letter grades).
Must be completed at a Regionally Accredited institution, including community colleges.
Must have earned 3 semester units or 4 quarter units.
Must have been taken for academic credit.
Must be degree applicable (not remedial).
For reading proficiency: a course in critical thinking, literature, philosophy, reading, rhetoric, or textual analysis.
For writing proficiency: a course in composition, English, rhetoric, written communication, or writing.
For mathematics proficiency: a course in algebra, geometry, mathematics, quantitative reasoning, or sta
tistics.

Students should consult with the teacher preparation program at the university (after transfer). Only the Commission on Teacher Credentialing or a commission approved program can verify coursework for the BSR.
