IV.03 SB-2223-02 Funding Request for Music Department, Action Item, 20 minutes The Senate acted on **SB-2223-02** to fund the Music Department in an amount not to exceed \$15,000.00 from the Senate Fund 600-03-015.

Senator Diaz moved to approve **SB-2223-02** and move into a roll call vote, seconded by Senator Buckley.

III.01 Student Equity Plan Feedback. Discussion Item, 20 minutes

Dr. Lui Amador, Dean of Student Equity & Success, will continue to receive student feedback on student equity efforts on campus.

- Senator Dunomes Umoja is stated often in the plan, raised concern it focuses too much on one program. Question as to function of Umoja to understand it's role. Possibly there are additional avenues to take, such as a Black Student Union (BSU).
 - Dr. Amador plan saw Umoja as a place to start, idea included in plan based off campus work group. Idea is that for program to thrive, the goal is to fund it at a higher level. BSU is an important strategy, looking for different efforts to help.

- Senator Dunomes believes students need another source of support, sense of belonging. Create more space for various communities on campus.
- Dr. Amador agree. Want to hear more from students what they need to feel connection to the campus. Keep the ideas coming. From last meeting will be taking back idea for a parent program and BSU expansion.
- Trustee Ledesma Does plan take into consider the needs of formerly incarcerated students?
 - Dr. Amador there needs to be more data gathered on that population before adding into plan. The current Student Equity Plan defines which student populations can be added, unfortunately not all are currently added.
- Dr. Amador this plan does not end when we submit it. A lot of energy toward it now, but only good if we use it. We have to use it to hold ourselves accountable.
- Senator Dunomes moves to extend time by 7 minutes. Seconded by Senator Diaz. No objections, motion passes.
