Regarding parking privileges. Removing this privilege has been on the minds of several administrators for over two years. They have instituted a new method for determining parking and eliminated hanging placards (which we used). They were willing to let us pick up parking permits for our meetings and special occasions at the President's Office, the Business Office or the police building. I discussed this with the police chief and suggested he simply not issue citations on the days we meet in the student center. We are to park in lots 10 and 2 between 10 AM and 3 PM. 
