CARE Program

Purpose and Goals

The Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE) Program supports EOPS students who are single parents receiving public assistance, by providing additional support services to assist students in transitioning from public assistance dependency by securing the education, training, and marketable skills needed for self-sufficiency and upward social mobility.



We serve EOPS-eligible students who are single parents receiving cash aid assistance from the county.

Number of Students Served Annually and Capacity

We generally serve 60-75 students with a capacity of 75-90.



High-Impact Interventions

We provide 1:1 mentoring & guidance, workshops & community building, and resource referrals.

Intended Impacts and Measured Outcomes

We intend to increase persistence, certificate and degree attainment, and transfer to 4-year university.
