TRANSFER TIMELINE

JUN

Begin brainstorming a response to UC Personal Insight questions.

JUL

UC application priority filing period (Winter quarter applicants, if open).

AUG

Begin scholarship research and applications (work on autobiographical essay).

SEP

Submit online UC TAG application. Petition for degree if completing last courses in the fall.

OCT

UC application priority filing period (fall semester/quarter applicants), attend application workshops through the Transfer Center.

Submit online FAFSA or Dream Act application for Financial Aid at www.fafsa.ed.gov (list up to 10 UC/CSU/Private universities you have applied for on the FAFSA application).

You may need to send a second official transcript once your transfer degree has been posted.

Transfer Center Services

University/College Representative Visits

Meet with representatives from various colleges/universities one-on-one to ask questions about admissions, majors, financial aid, and more. To make an appointment call or drop-in at the Transfer Center. Check the Events link on our website.

University/College Fairs

Visit with numerous university/college representatives on campus. Fairs are offered throughout the academic year.

University/College Workshops

Attend a "Transfer 101-Orientation to the Transfer Admission Process", "Transfer Admission Guarantee", and/or "Application Workshop". All workshops are designed to provide vital information on the transfer process, university academic programs and how to fill out the application and write the personal statement.

Three-day University Tours (Coming back Spring 2024)

Every year students are given the opportunity to visit universities in Northern California such as UCB, UCD and UCSC. Transportation and hotel expenses over the 3-day trip are paid for by the college (meals are not included). Spaces are limited and students must complete an application. Check with the Transfer Center for applications.

University Tours and Presentations

Join us on a campus tour of local area colleges and universities. Transportation is provided to over a dozen different universities, including UC, CSU, and independent/private colleges. Take advantage of this great opportunity to check out the campus environment, ask your specific questions, and attend workshops.

Transfer Admission Guarantees (TAGs)/University Partnerships

TAGs, which are available for 6 UCs, 4 private California colleges,3 out-of-state universities and 39 HBCUs, allow students to guarantee their admission a full term prior to transfer. Walk-in Wednesdays (5 p.m. -7 p.m.)

Transfer Conference


Join us for a one-day conference providing students with various workshops including university and student panels.

Transfer Academy

A university preparation program designed to guide student admissions to the California State University and University of California systems.

Transfer Counseling

Student with the goal of transfer to the 4-year university/college can schedule an appointment to research admission requirements, create a comprehensive educational plan, review personal insight questions and/or learn more about TAG opportunities. (in-person/virtual appointment available)



Associate's Degree—Major courses plus general education and electives, 60 degree applicable units required. Usually referred to as an AA degree. Normally requires 2 years of full-time study, but may take longer. Offered by community colleges.

Bachelor's Degree—Major plus general education and electives, approximately 120-132 total semester units required. Usually referred to as BA or BS (Bachelor of Art or Science) degree. Normally requires 4-5 years of full-time study. Students may complete the freshman and sophomore years at the community college (as shown above) and then transfer to a 4-year university for the junior and senior level courses.

Master's Degree—Bachelor's degree plus graduate courses in a specialized area. Masters is usually 26-56 units over the bachelor's depending on major. Usually referred to as MA or MS (Masters of Arts or Science). Normally requires 2 additional years of full-time study after completion of bachelor's.

Doctorate Degree—Advanced training beyond bachelor's or master's degree. Units vary depending on field of study. It usually takes 4-5 years of full-time study.


Lower Division Coursework: Defined as freshman and sophomore level coursework.

Upper Division Coursework: Defined as junior and senior level coursework.

Transfer Student: A student who will have the required minimum number of transferable units and appropriate course patterns completed. Admissions will be based on college work only. (Check with individual campuses regarding lower division classification and appropriate requirements). Meet with a counselor to set up an educational plan, as competitive as possible for admission into your university of choice.



CSU Admissions Checklist

Due to the California state budget, the CSU campuses are becoming increasingly competitive for admissions selection. It is extremely important that you stay current on admission practices for your school of choice, in addition to the following checklist below. Admission practices can change mid-year without prior notification. Please contact a university representative or a Transfer Center counselor for more information.

1.	Review your academic records with a Cerritos counselor AND a university representative to determine your eligibility and competitiveness as a transfer applicant. Follow an educational plan.
2.	Find out if the CSU campus and major you are interested in is impacted. If so, find out what the admissions requirements are and when they should be completed, i.e., grade point average, major courses required and any other supplemental materials such as portfolios, interviews or letters of recommendation.
3.	Take courses for your major, especially if your major is impacted.
4.	Learn more about A Degree with a Guarantee (see Page 17).
5	Find out which general education pattern is appropriate for your campus and/or major choice. In general, the CSU general education pattern (plan B) is preferred, but there are some prominent exceptions.
6.	Do not delay taking your transfer Math, English Composition, Critical Thinking and Communication courses ("The Golden Four").
7.	If you took AP exams in high school and recieved a score of 3 or higher, ask a counselor for a CSU evaluation of those scores. Cerritos evaluates AP scores differently than CSU campuses.
8.	Inquire about the benefits of joining the Scholars' Honors Program (SHP), and Transfer Academy
9.	Visit the CSU campus you are interested in attending. Inquire about university tours at the Transfer Center.
10.	Apply broadly. Don't put all of your eggs in one basket. Apply to at least one non-impacted campus if your first choice campus is impacted. Consider listing an alternate major, if your first choice major is impacted. Apply on time and observe all of the important application filing deadlines. Some CSU campuses don't accept applications in the winter quarter/spring semester.
11.	Meet with the Transfer Center counselor. Attend admissions and application workshops. Go to the Transfer Center website for dates and times. www.cerritos.edu/transfer .
12.	Check and read all emails sent from the university. Make sure you follow up on any additional requirements like completing Supplemental Applications and sending offical transcript by specified deadlines.
13.	Learn to use these valuable websites to access helpful transfer information: www.calstate.edu Explore CSU campuses, access transfer information & apply online. www.assist.org: Find major preparation that transfers from Cerritos to the CSU/UC system.





UC Personal INSIGHT QUESTIONS

The personal insight questions are an important part of your application. There are limitations to what grades and test scores can tell universities about you. The university uses your response to the questions to learn more about you as an individual -- your talents, experiences, achievements and points of view. Think of the personal insight questions as your opportunity to introduce yourself to the admissions officers and faculty who will be evaluating your application. What would you like them to know about you that may not be evident from a review of the rest of your application?

When you use the PATHWAYS electronic application, there will be separate entry boxes for each question and a word counter to help applicants track the length of their responses. Because of the 30-minute time limit in place on each page of the application, it is advised that you DO NOT compose your answers on the electronic application. Compose and save them using a word processing program, then copy and paste them in the appropriate entry boxes. Proofread your personal statement very carefully.

Instructions:

There is one required question you must answer. You must also answer 3 out of 7 additional questions. Each response is limited to a maximum of 350 words. Which three questions you choose to answer are up to you, but you should select questions that are most relevant to your experience and that best reflect your individual circumstances.

Required question - Please describe how you have prepared for your intended major, including your readiness to succeed in your upper-division courses once you enroll at the university.

Choose to answer any three of the following seven questions:

- 1. Describe an example of your leadership experience in which you have positively influenced others, helped resolve disputes, or contributed to group efforts over time.
- 2. Every person has a creative side, and it can be expressed in many ways: problem solving, original and innovative thinking, and artistically, to name a few. Describe how you express your creative side.
- 2. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?
- 4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.
- 5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?
- 6. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?
- 7. What is the one thing that you think sets you apart from other candidates applying to the University of California?

Keep in mind

All questions are equal: All questions are given equal consideration in the application review process, which means there is no advantage or disadvantage to choosing certain questions over others. There is no right or wrong way to answer these questions: It's about getting to know your personality, background, interests and achievements in your own unique voice.

A university preparation program designed to guide admissions to a University of California and California State University.



Transfer Admission Guarantees (TAG)-Out-of-State

Historically Black Colleges & University (HBCU) For a full list of partner HBCU's, check the Transfer Center website or our Post Guide-Transfer Advantage

- Acceptance of completed transfer-level community college courses
- A free single application for up to four participating partner HBCU institutions
- A simplified transfer process
- Priority consideration for housing when application submitted by the posted deadline
- Consideration for transfer scholarships if you have a 3.2 or higher grade point average (based on funding availability)
- Pre-admission advisement

Eligibility for above identified HBCU's:

First Option (guaranteed Junior Standing)

- Obtain a transfer-level associate degree with a GPA of 2.0-2.5 or higher
- Complete either the University of California General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC), or the California State University General Education Breadth Pattern (CSU GE)

OR

Second Option

• Earn 30 or more CSU or UC transferable units with a GPA of 2.5 or higher

Other advantages conferred to transfer students under the agreement include priority consideration for housing, consideration for transfer scholarships for students with a 3.2 or higher GPA, and pre-admission advising.

For certain majors, students may need to fulfill additional prerequisites and other requirements.

Eight of the participating colleges and universities are private institutions. Lincoln University of Missouri is public, and will offer in-state tuition for California community college transfer students.

Out-of-State Universities – Minimum qualifications:

WESTERN OREGON UNIVERSITY

- Cumulative GPA of 2.25 or higher
- Completion of 24 semester credits. No more than four PE or non-academic elective credits will be counted toward the 24 semester units.
- · Completion of English 100 with a C- or higher
- Completion of Math 112 or higher transferable math course with a C- or higher

NORTHERN ARIZONA UNIVERSITY

 Earned a minimum of 35 credits and the California IGETC with a cumulative GPA of 2.5

OF

 Earned an Associate's degree with a cumulative GPA of 2.0

ARIZONA STATE UNIVERSITY

- High school diploma or a GED with a score of 500 or more, plus one of the following:
- 24 college-level (non-remedial) transferable hours with a 3.0 or higher cumulative transfer GPA (4.00 = A) or
- An Intersegmental General Education Transfer
 Curriculum (IGETC), or California State University General
 Education (CSU GE) with a minimum 2.50 cumulative
 transfer GPA

OR

An associate degree with a 2.50 or higher GPA (high school diploma or GED waived)

Transfer Admission Guarantees (TAG)

The Transfer Admission Guarantee program offers guaranteed admission to students who complete a core set of courses at a California Community College a full term prior to transferring.

University of California

Fall transfers: TAG Filing period is the month of September

UC TAG Programs with Cerritos College

You can sign a TAG agreement with any one of the following UC campuses:

Davis • Irvine • Merced • Riverside • Santa Barbara • Santa Cruz

Common UC TAG requirements:

- Have completed 30 transferable units to sign a contract
- Complete 60 transferable units and the 7-course pattern (one transferable math course, two English courses, 4 courses from at least two of the following areas: Arts & Humanities, Social & Behavioral Sciences, Physical & Biological Sciences) by end of Spring prior to Fall transfer for all UC campuses. (AP units can be used)
- Have a GPA between 2.8 3.6 depending on major and TAG school of choice
- Complete one transferable math course and two English courses one year prior to transferring (condition applies for majority of TAG schools)
- Attend Transfer Admissions Guarantee Eligibility workshop to learn the specifics for participating UC TAG schools (check www.cerritos.edu/transfer for TAG workshop dates and times)
- Complete UC TAG application online at https://uctap.universityofcalifornia.edu/
- TAG applications opens July 1st. TAG filing period occurs September 1-30.

Independent University

Minimum qualifications:

Whittier College

- Complete transfer English and Math with a "C" or better on or before the transfer
- 30 transferable units with a "C" or better
- Minimum transfer GPA 2.8

University of La Verne

- GPA required for minimum eligibility: 2.7
- Completion of 28 units to include English Composition
- Transfer within two years of signing TAG

LOYOLA MARYMOUNT UNIVERSITY

- GPA requirement for minimum eligibility: 3.25-3.50
- Completion of 30 units to include transfer level English and Math
- Major Preparation required for some majors.

PEPPERDINE GRAZIADIO SCHOOL of BUSINESS and MANAGEMENT

Overall 2.8 GPA and 3 years professional experience plus one of the following:



CSU Pathway


Students are given guaranteed admission into the California State University (CSU) system, and further are given priority consideration when applying to a particular program that is **similar** to the student's community college major. Students must have 100% completion of the following components. **60 units + 60 units = YOUR BACHELOR'S DEGREE**



Priority Admission Grade Point Bump Guideline:

Program Impacted: additional .10 GPA index point

Campus & Program Impacted: additional .10 GPA index point



Students must submit a petition for AAT/AST to the admissions office. Download the petition at www.cerritos.edu/admissions under forms.

Calculating the Transferable GPA

Step 1 – Obtain a copy of your transcripts from all colleges attended; line out the classes that are not transferable (refer to the Cerritos General Catalog to find out what classes are transferable or go to the Assist website www.assist.org). For instructions on how to use the Assist website go to page 18.

Step 2 – Add up the units attempted for each class and the grade points for those classes listed. Grade points are calculated by multiplying units attempted by the grade point value for the grade received in each class.

A=4 / B= 3 / C=2 / D=1 / F=0

When calculating GPA, a unit attempted is a course in which a grade of A, B, C, D, or F has been earned.

Step 3 – Once you have added all the units attempted and the grade points, compute your GPA by dividing the number of grade points by units attempted.

In the example above there are only 9 transferable units and 24 transferable grade points. Grade points were computed by multiplying the number of units that the class is worth times the number of assigned letter grade points. To compute the transferable GPA you must divide total transferable grade points by total transferable units. Therefore, the Transferable GPA is:

Example: 24 / 9 = 2.67

Total Transferable Grade Points ÷ Total Transferable Units Attempted = Transferable GPA

Repeat – Couse repitition allows such courses for which only substandard work has been recorded, to be repeated only once. The previous grade and units will be disregarded in the computation of Cerritos College GPA.

Academic Renewal – A procedure that permits alleviation of previously recorded substandard ("D" and "F") academic performance which is not reflective of a student's present demostrated ability. At least 24 units of college work from an accredited institution with a GPA of 2.0 must be completed after the cousework to be alleviated. See a counselor for more information.

Note: Pass/No Pass, Credit/No Credit, Incompletes and/or withdrawels are not calculated in your GPA.

Articulation System Stimulating Interinstitutional Student Transfer www.assist.org

Articulation: Articulation agreements are formal agreements between two campuses. They define how courses taken at one college or university can be used to satisfy a subject matter requirement at another college or university, usually looking from California community college to California public 4-year universities. To see articulation agreements, start by choosing a college or university.

There are many ways to use ASSIST.



Submit Documents


