Nursing Basic: Criminal background check, health insurance, immunizations, medical clearance, and malpractice insurance are required for clinical coursework.

RN students must:

- 1. Hold a current license or be eligible for a license to practice in California
- 2. Graduation from an Accredited Associate Degree program or evaluation of diploma program for equivalency by an Accredited Associate Degree program
- 3. Have 56 to 70 transferable units including statistics and a 5-unit chemistry course (CHEM 140 preferred)
- 4. A minimum GPA of 2.75 in all community college courses required for the Associate Degree in Nursing
- 5. Maintain malpractice and health insurance throughout clinical coursework and submit to a criminal background check
- 6. Attend a group counseling session for RN students and complete the RN application form
- 7. Submit official transcripts of any previous college work to the School of Nursing
- 8. Fulfill the Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR) either prior to admission or within the first semester in the program.

Prerequisites: Satisfactory completion of an undergraduate statistics course suitable for general education math credit and an inorganic, organic, and/or biochemistry course.

Prerequisite lab courses taken with an online laboratory during the COVID-19 pandemic will be accepted.
