# Cerritos College Counseling

- PLAN A is designed primarily for those students interested in preparing for a vocational career upon graduation. PLAN A may also be used by university transfer students and for students in vocational majors who may possibly wish to transfer in the future. However, some courses listed in PLAN A are not transferable to the four-year universities. Therefore, students following PLAN A should see a counselor for guidance in selecting the general education plan that will best suit their educational and career goals.
- A minimum of 60-degree applicable units must be completed with a
   2.0 grade point average to qualify for the AA degree. The 60 units is
   to include a minimum of 18 units of specific courses for a major, a
   minimum of 18 units of identified general education courses and
   requirements, any units taken to meet the proficiency requirements,
   and electives as needed.
- Students planning to transfer to a California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) campus need additional specific general education units beyond the 18 units required for this plan. Depending on the student's transfer plans, the additional units should be selected from either PLAN B (CSU General Education Certification) or PLAN C (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum). When selecting their courses, students are advised to check that the courses they select for PLAN A will count in the appropriate transfer general education category for PLAN B or PLAN C.
- Associate in Arts (AA-T) and Associate in Science (AS-T) for Transfer majors are required to fully complete Plan B or Plan C.
- NOTE: Courses denoted with one asterisk (\*) appear in more than one category but may be used to satisfy only one category. Courses denoted with two asterisks (\*\*) do not meet the general education requirements listed in PLAN B or PLAN C. Courses with three asterisks (\*\*\*) do not meet the requirements for IGETC.
- Courses marked with a CL are cross listed with another course. See individual cross-listed course descriptions in the Cerritos College catalog. Cross-listed courses may only receive credit once.
- Courses in BOLD and <u>UNDERLINED</u> have no prerequisites but may have course recommendations. Please refer to the catalog for course recommendations.

### PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

- Pass intermediate algebra college courses or Math courses numbered 100 or above, PSYC 210, ECON 210 or equivalents with a grade of "C" or higher or "Pass"
  - a. Receive a score of 3 or better on a Math AP exam (AP Statistics, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC)."
  - b. Receive credit by exam in Math 80

- 2) Writing This requirement can be met by one of the following options:
  - a) Completion of ENGL 100 or ENGL 100s or equivalent with a grade of "C" or higher or "Pass"
  - b) Completion of ESL 180 or equivalent with a grade of "C" or higher or "Pass"

#### 3) Reading

- a. Completion of READ 100, READ 101, or READ 103, or equivalent with a grade of "C" or higher or Pass.
- **b.** Completion of any Plan B Area A3 course or any Plan C Area 1B course or equivalent with a grade of "C" or higher or Pass.
- c. Receive a score of 3 or better on the English Language & Composition or English Literature and Composition AP Exam.
- d. Receive a credit by exam in READ 101 at Cerritos College.
