# The Economic Value of Cerritos Community College District



COVID-19 disclaimer: The data used to generate the findings within this report reflect extraordinary circumstances caused by the national COVID-19 Pandemic. From a financial perspective, the colleges may have seen an increase in expenditures related to quickly transitioning to online or hybrid education and spending on equipment and staff related to the health and welfare of faculty and students. One-time funding may have been received by the colleges through the CARES Act which included the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund grant. Additionally, students were directly impacted over this period. Rapid changes in the modality of the colleges' programs can have an impact on students' persistence and completion rates. Changes in income and employment can have adverse effects on a student's ability to maintain enrollment or their choice to enroll in college. Childcare availability, health, and safety considerations may have also had adverse effects on enrollment. Lastly, a number of economic indicators used within this report may be reflective of broader changes to the economy during this time, such as unemployment rates and changes in wages.

ERRITOS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT (Cerritos College) creates value in many ways. The college plays a key role in helping students increase their employability and achieve their individual potential. The college retains students in the region, generating new dollars and opportunities for the Cerritos College Service Area. Cerritos College provides students with the education, training, and skills they need to have fulfilling and prosperous careers. Furthermore, Cerritos College is a place for students to meet new people, increase their self-confidence, and promote their overall health and well-being.

Cerritos College influences both the lives of its students and the regional economy. The college supports a variety of industries in the Cerritos College Service Area, serves regional businesses, and benefits society as a whole in California from an expanded economy and improved quality of life. Additionally, the benefits created by Cerritos College extend to the state and local government through increased tax revenues and public sector savings.

This study measures the economic impacts created by Cerritos College on the business community and the benefits the college generates in return for the investments made by its key stakeholder groups—students, taxpayers, and society. The following two analyses are presented:



#### **Economic impact analysis**



#### **Investment analysis**

All results reflect employee, student, and financial data, provided by the college, for fiscal year (FY) 2021-22. Impacts on the Cerritos College Service Area economy are reported under the economic impact analysis and are measured in terms of added income. The returns on investment to students, taxpayers, and society in California are reported under the investment analysis.

## **Economic impact analysis**



Cerritos College promotes economic growth in the Cerritos College Service Area through its direct expenditures and the resulting expenditures of students and regional businesses. The college serves as an employer and buyer of goods and services for its day-to-day and construction operations. The college's activities retain students in the Cerritos College Service Area, whose expenditures benefit regional vendors. In addition, Cerritos College is one of the primary sources of higher education to the Cerritos College Service Area residents and a supplier of trained workers to regional industries, enhancing overall productivity in the regional workforce.


## **Operations spending impact**

Cerritos College adds economic value to the Cerritos College Service Area as an employer of regional residents and a large-scale buyer of goods and services. In FY 2021-22, the college employed 1,163 full-time and part-time faculty and staff, 24% of whom lived in the Cerritos College Service Area. Total payroll at Cerritos College was \$139.2 million, much of which was spent in the region for groceries, mortgage and rent payments, dining out, and other household expenses. In addition, the college spent \$55.3 million on day-to-day expenses related to facilities, supplies, and professional services (excluding construction).

Cerritos College's day-to-day operations spending added \$143.9 million in income to the region during the analysis year. This figure represents the college's payroll, the multiplier effects generated by the in-region spending of the college and its employees, and a downward adjustment to account for funding that the college received from regional sources. The \$143.9 million in added income is equivalent to supporting 1,192 jobs in the region.

## **Construction spending impact**

Cerritos College invests in construction each year to maintain its facilities, create additional capacities, and meet its growing educational demands. While the amount varies from year to year, these quick infusions of income and jobs have a substantial impact on the regional economy. In FY 2021-22, Cerritos College's construction spending generated \$4.3 million in added income, which is equivalent to supporting 54 jobs.



## Student spending impact

Some in-region students, referred to as retained students, would have left the Cerritos College Service Area if not for the existence of Cerritos College. While attending the college, these retained students spent money on groceries, accommodation, transportation, and other household expenses. This spending generated \$11.0 million in added income for the regional economy in FY 2021-22, which supported 146 jobs in the Cerritos College Service Area.

## Alumni impact

The education and training Cerritos College provides for regional residents has the greatest impact. Since the establishment of the college, students have studied at Cerritos College and entered the regional workforce with greater knowledge and new skills. Today, thousands of former Cerritos College students are employed in the Cerritos College Service Area. As a result of their education from Cerritos College, the students receive higher earnings and increase the productivity of the businesses that employ them. In FY 2021-22, Cerritos College alumni generated \$378.2 million in added income for the regional economy, which is equivalent to supporting 4,208 jobs.

**Total impact** 

Cerritos College added \$537.4 million in income to the Cerritos College Service Area economy during the analysis year, equal to the sum of the operations and construction spending impacts; the student spending impact; and the alumni impact. For context, the \$537.4 million impact was equal to approximately 2.0% of the total gross regional product (GRP) of the Cerritos College Service Area. This contribution that the college provided on its own is larger than the entire Information industry in the region.

Cerritos College's total impact can also be expressed in terms of jobs supported. The \$537.4 million impact supported 5,599 regional jobs, using the jobs-to-sales ratios specific to each industry in the region. This means that one out of every 42 jobs

in the Cerritos College Service Area is supported by the activities of Cerritos College and its students. In addition, the \$537.4 million, or 5,599 supported jobs, stemmed from different industry sectors. For instance, among non-education industry sectors, the spending of Cerritos College and its students and the activities of its alumni in the Health Care & Social Assistance industry sector supported 570 jobs in FY 2021-22. If the

college did not exist, these impacts would not have been generated in the Cerritos College Service Area.

## **Investment analysis**



An investment analysis evaluates the costs associated with a proposed venture against its expected benefits. If the benefits outweigh the costs, then the investment is financially worthwhile. The analysis presented here evaluates Cerritos College as an investment from the perspectives of students, taxpayers, and society in California.

## Student perspective

In FY 2021-22, Cerritos College served 26,691 credit and 2,071 non-credit students. In order to attend the college, the students paid for tuition, fees, books, and supplies. They also took out loans and will incur interest on those loans. Additionally, students gave up money they would have otherwise earned had they been working instead of attending college. The total investment made by Cerritos College's students in FY 2021-22 amounted to a present value of \$83.7 million, equal to \$17.3 million in out-of-pocket expenses (including future principal and interest on student loans) and \$66.4 million in forgone time and money.

In return for their investment, Cerritos College's students will receive a stream of higher future earnings that will continue to grow throughout their working lives. For example, the average Cerritos College associate degree graduate from FY 2021-22 will see annual earnings that are \$10,200 higher than a person with a high school diploma or equivalent working in California. Over a working lifetime, the benefits of the associate degree over a high school diploma will amount to an undiscounted value of \$387.6 thousand in higher earnings per graduate. The present value of the cumulative higher future earnings that Cerritos College's FY 2021-22 students will receive over their working careers is \$534.1 million.

The students' benefit-cost ratio is 6.4. In other words, for every dollar students invest in Cerritos College in the form of out-of-pocket expenses and forgone time and money, they will receive a cumulative value of \$6.40 in higher future earnings. Annually, the students' investment in Cerritos College has an average annual internal rate of return

of 23.3%, which is impressive compared to the U.S. stock market's 30-year average rate of return of 9.6%.

## **Taxpayer perspective**

Cerritos College generates more in tax revenue than it receives. These benefits to taxpayers consist primarily of taxes that the state and local government will collect from the added revenue created in the state. As Cerritos College students will earn more, they will make higher tax payments throughout their working lives. Students' employers will also make higher tax payments as they increase their output and purchases of goods and services. By the end of the FY 2021-22 students' working lives, the state and local

government will have collected a present value of \$208.3 million in added taxes.

Benefits to taxpayers will also consist of savings generated by the improved lifestyles of Cerritos College students and the corresponding reduced government services. Education is statistically correlated with a variety of lifestyle changes. The education that Cerritos College students receive

will generate savings in three main categories: 1) healthcare, 2) justice system, and 3) income assistance. Improved health will lower students' demand for national health care services. In addition, costs related to the justice system will decrease. Cerritos College students will be more employable, so their reduced demand for income assistance such as welfare and unemployment benefits will benefit taxpayers. Altogether, the present value of the benefits associated with an education from Cerritos College will generate \$32.6 million in savings to state and local taxpayers.

Total taxpayer benefits amount to \$240.9 million, the present value sum of the added tax revenue and public sector savings. Taxpayer costs are \$151.5 million, equal to the amount of state and local government funding Cerritos College received in FY 2021-22. These benefits and costs yield a benefit-cost ratio of 1.6. This means that for every dollar of public money invested in Cerritos College in FY 2021-22, taxpayers will receive a cumulative present value of \$1.60 over the course of the students' working lives. The average annual internal rate of return for taxpayers is 3.0%, which compares favorably to other long-term investments in the public sector.

## Social perspective

Society as a whole in California benefits from the presence of Cerritos College in two major ways. Primarily, society benefits from an increased economic base in the state. This is attributed to the added income from students' increased lifetime earnings (added student income) and increased business output (added business income), which raise economic prosperity in California.


Benefits to society also consist of the savings generated by the improved lifestyles of Cerritos College students. As discussed in the previous section, education is statistically correlated with a variety of lifestyle changes that generate social savings. Note that these costs are avoided by the consumers but are distinct from the costs avoided by the taxpayers outlined above. Healthcare savings include avoided medical costs associated with smoking, alcohol dependence, obesity, drug abuse, and depression. Justice system savings include avoided costs to the government and society due to less judicial activity. Income assistance savings include reduced welfare and unemployment claims. 
Altogether, the social benefits of Cerritos College equal a present value of \$3.1 billion. These benefits include \$1.9 billion in added student income, \$850.7 million in added business income, \$221.7 million in added income from college activities, as well as \$47.2 million in social savings related to health, the justice system, and income assistance in California. People in California invested a present value total of \$291.2 million in Cerritos College in FY 2021-22. The cost includes all the college and student costs.

The benefit-cost ratio for society is 10.5, equal to the \$3.1 billion in benefits divided by the \$291.2 million in costs. In other words, for every dollar invested in Cerritos College, people in California will receive a cumulative value of \$10.50 in benefits. The benefits of this investment will occur for as long as Cerritos College's FY 2021-22 students remain employed in the state workforce.


## **Summary of investment analysis results**

The results of the analysis demonstrate that Cerritos College is a strong investment for all three major stakeholder groups—students, taxpayers, and society. As shown, students receive a great return for their investments in an education from Cerritos College. At the same time, taxpayers' investment in Cerritos College returns more to government budgets than it costs and creates a wide range of social benefits throughout California.






#### Social benefits in California from Cerritos College
