CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS

There will be no separate discussion of these items unless Members of the Board of Trustees, the public, or staff request that specific items be removed from the Consent Calendar for separate discussion and action.

6. Student and Employee International Travel--Taiwan (Office of Academic Affairs)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve international travel to Taiwan for Cerritos College students and an advisor, Amna Jara, Student Activities Coordinator, to Taiwan to participate in a program of (a) study in courses in the discipline of education, (b) internships in student teaching at the primary and/or secondary level, and (c) cultural awareness development opportunities. In addition, two Cerritos College representatives, Dr. Jose Fierro, President/Superintendent and Dr. Shin Liu, Trustee, will travel to Taiwan to execute a memoranda of understanding and/or other agreements to establish multi-year programs identical or similar in nature to the student course of study, internship, and cultural awareness development program. Funding in the amount of \$13,800.00 has been authorized by ASCC for up to 10 Cerritos College students and one advisor. In addition, funding in the amount of \$2,400 has been allocated from the General Fund for two round-trip flights and incidentals for Dr. Fierro and Dr. Liu.

7. Ratification of Conference Request for Travel Outside the United States - Kyoto, Japan for Dr. Jianli Hu (Office of Academic Affairs)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve a conference request for Dr. Hu, full-time faculty member in the Business, Humanities, and Social Sciences division, to travel to Kyoto, Japan from April 27, 2017 to April 28, 2017 as she was invited by Jinhau Municipal Trade office in Zhejiang, China to share research results on international business and marketing related to the city's world-famous small commodity market. No fiscal impact.

8. New Courses and Programs, and Modifications to Existing Courses and Programs (Office of Academic Affairs)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve new course offerings and modifications to curriculum, as attached. There is no fiscal impact.

9. Stipends for the Assessment, Remediation and Retention for Associate Degree Nursing Registered Nursing (RN) Program Grant RFA # 16-200-002 for Spring 2017 (Office of Academic Affairs)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve payment of a stipend in the total amount of \$1,800 to a nursing faculty member for work which will be performed January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017, as stipulated in – and funded by – the RFA # 16-200-002 Assessment, Remediation and Retention for Associate Degree Nursing Registered Nursing (RN) Program Grant. The RFA # 16-200-002 Assessment, Remediation and Retention for Associate Degree Nursing Registered Nursing (RN) Program Grant will be utilized for this expenditure. No general funds will be used. The stipend will be paid as work is completed. The Remediation workshop is for students who did not pass the Testing of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) pre-admission assessment test.

10. BSI-Funded Stipends for AIME Basic Skills Initiative for Spring 2017 (Office of Academic Affairs)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve stipends totaling \$15,050 for faculty who are participating in the Accelerated Instruction in Math and English (AIME) program providing math and English pathways, integrated student support, and reintegration of services that allow students to complete their developmental education sequence and college-level math and/or English in a timely manner. General funds will not be used for these stipends. Basic Skills Initiative funds will be utilized.

11. Stipends for Center for Teaching Excellence Summer Institute Taking Place Summer Semester 2017 (Office of Academic Affairs)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve stipends for Center for Teaching Excellence Summer Institute taking place summer semester 2017. Funds from the Center for Teaching Excellence (CTX) budget will be utilized for this expenditure for a total amount not to exceed \$15,500.

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify Change Order No. 3 [Owner Added Scope] in the amount of \$13,362 for the Fine Arts-CIS/Math Building project. The amount from Change Order No. 3 will be \$13,362, increasing the contract amount to \$512,987. Funding will be allocated from the GO Bond.

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify Change Order No. 11 [Errors] in the amount of \$22,662 for the Fine Arts-CIS/Math Building project. The amount from Change Order No. 11 will be \$22,662, increasing the contract amount to \$3,763,891. Funding will be allocated from the GO Bond.

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify Change Order No. 5 [Unforeseen Changes, Agency Driven Changes] in the amount of \$39,967 for the Fine Arts-CIS/Math Building project. The amount from Change Order No. 5 will be \$39,967, increasing the total contract amount to \$2,070,079. Funding will be allocated from the GO Bond.

16. Ratification of Change Order No. 6 [Owner Added Scope, Agency Driven Changes], (Bid No. 13P032, Category 18), Empyrean Plumbing, Inc., Fine Arts-CIS/Math Building (Office of Business Services)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify Change Order No. 6 [Owner Added Scope, Agency Driven Changes] in the amount of \$23,466 for the Fine Arts-CIS/Math Building project. The amount from Change Order No. 6 will be \$23,466, increasing the total contract amount to \$2,070,079. Funding will be allocated from the GO Bond.

17. Ratification of Change Order No. 3 [Unforeseen Conditions, Agency Driven Changes, Owner Added Scope, Errors], (Bid No. 13P032, Category 19), RDM Electric, Inc., Fine Arts-CIS/Math Building (Office of Business Services)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify Change Order No. 3 [Unforeseen Conditions, Agency Driven Changes, Owner Added Scope, Errors] in the amount of \$155,808 for the Fine Arts-CIS/Math Building project. The amount from Change Order No. 3 will be \$155,808, increasing the contract amount to \$5,883,484. Funding will be allocated from the GO Bond.

18. Ratification of Change Order No. 4 [Agency Driven Changes, Errors, Owner Added Scope], (Bid No. 13P032, Category 19), RDM Electric, Inc., Fine Arts-CIS/Math Building (Office of Business Services)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify Change Order No. 4 [Agency Driven Changes, Errors, Owner Added Scope] in the amount of \$34,861 for the Fine Arts-CIS/Math Building project. The amount from Change Order No. 4 will be \$34,861, increasing the contract amount to \$5,918,345. Funding will be allocated from the GO Bond.

19. Resolution No. 17-0503B To Let Purchase Orders or Contracts with Apple, Inc. as a Sole Source Procurement of Product (Office of Business Services)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve Resolution No. 17-0503B, authorizing Cerritos College to let sole source purchase orders or contracts to Apple, Inc., without formal, public advertising and receiving of bids, for fiscal year 2017-2018 as needed, to buy Apple manufactured products for instructional and administrative use, for the reasons set forth below. Procurements for Apple products are processed by departments. Funding for the procurements will be allocated from various District funding sources.

20. Purchase Materials Through Other Public Agency Contracts (Office of Business Services)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve that the college may make procurements by means of existing public agency contracts pursuant to California Public Contract Code Section 20650 et seq. and Education Code 81646, and authorize Cerritos College to make such procurements, as-needed, which is in Cerritos College's best interests, for fiscal year 2017-2018. There is no financial impact.

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the agreement with ABC Unified School District for a subcontract as part of the Partnership for Adult Academic and Career Education (PAACE) Regional Consortium which is funded by the Adult Education Block Grant (AEBG) through the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. The total contract sum shall be for the not-to-exceed amount of \$62,900; funding is made possible from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office through the Partnership for Adult Academic and Career Education (PAACE) regional consortium.

24. Agreement with Downey Unified School District for the Partnership for Adult Academic and Career Education (PAACE) Regional Consortium (Office of Business Services)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the agreement with Downey Unified School District for a subcontract as part of the Partnership for Adult Academic and Career Education (PAACE) Regional Consortium which is funded by the Adult Education Block Grant (AEBG) through the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. The total contract sum shall be for the not-to-exceed amount of \$50,900; funding is made possible from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office through the Partnership for Adult Academic and Career Education (PAACE) regional consortium.

25. Agreement with Norwalk-La Mirada Unified School District for the Partnership for Adult Academic and Career Education (PAACE) Regional Consortium (Office of Business Services)

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the agreement with Norwalk-La Mirada Unified School District for a subcontract as part of the Partnership for Adult Academic and Career Education (PAACE) Regional Consortium which is funded by the Adult Education Block Grant (AEBG) through the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. The total contract sum shall be for the not-to-exceed amount of \$38,900; funding is made possible from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office through the Partnership for Adult Academic and Career Education (PAACE) regional consortium.

26. Ratification of the Amendment to the Agreement with the Los Angeles Universal Preschool (LAUP) for the CSPP Quality Improvement Block Grant (Office of Business Services)

Cerritos College will continue to receive funding in the amount of \$38,000; funding is made possible through the California Department of Education through the CSPP QRIS Block Grant which was received by the Los Angeles County of Education (“LACOE”). LACOE is the administrative agent for the funding in collaboration with the Los Angeles County Office of Child Care and LAUP. No District general funds will be used.

The total sum shall remain for the not-to-exceed amount of \$150,000. Funding for services to implement the Student Data Warehouse – Phase 2 is allocated from Vintage funds.
