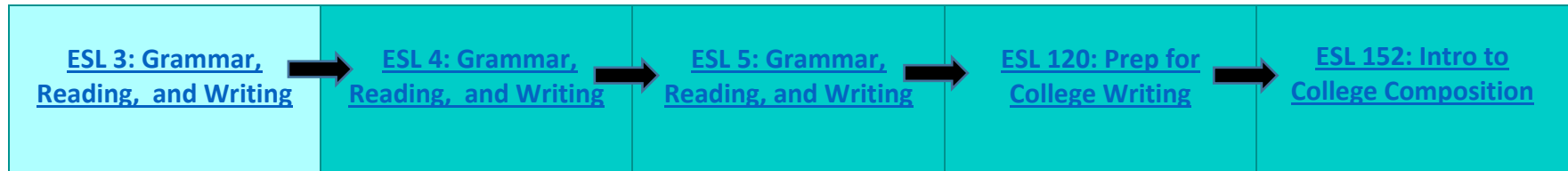


ESL 3: Grammar, Reading, and Writing

Why this course: You should enroll in ESL 3 if you are a multilingual/ESL student who wants to build confidence using high-beginning level grammar and sentence structures and writing simple paragraphs with appropriate organization, development, grammar, vocabulary, sentence structure, and punctuation. To do so, you will write short paragraphs on one topic, read and discuss authentic articles, and learn to use correct grammar, sentence structure, and vocabulary.

What you should already know:

- You should already have a foundation of low to high beginning written English skills.

What will be challenging:

- Listening to and reading short passages
- Writing simple paragraphs and giving informal presentations
- Editing sentences for correct grammar, sentence structure, and vocabulary

- Spend 5 to 10 hours a week completing homework and studying for the course

- Attend grammar, listening/speaking, and pronunciation workshops in the Language Success Center
