3-WEEK PROGRAM INCLUDES

- **Multiple orientation meetings** covering topics such as general acclimation to Taiwan, safety and security issues, cultural differences, travel, money, and cultural activities.
- **Local area walking tour**

- **Excursion Entrances & Transportation.**

POL 220: Comparative Government

3 units

Transfer Credit; Cal-GETC Area 4

This course is a study of different kinds of political systems including comparative analysis of their history, political institutions, processes and policies, the environment in which they occur, and differing ideologies, current political problems and their consequences.

FOUNDATIONAL MANDARIN LESSONS
