- 1. Strengths:
 - a. well produced & professional
 - b. appropriately timed, not too long
 - c. student remarks
 - d. Can view it at one's convenience (and had premiere), is flexible to folk's availability
 - e. Recording makes it easier to hear what was said, very clear

 - a. Sun on the stage

- iii. CARmencement (640 cars actually showed up, 650 estimate grad attendance. 740 RSVP's)
 - 1. Strengths:
 - a. Well organized everything ready for workers
 - b. Communication to campus (fac/staff/mgrs.) good
 - c. Appeared to run smooth
 - d. Faculty/staff cheering section lively and a lot of fun
 - e. Teamwork
 - f. Students could be with their families, to celebrate together. Very celebratory
 - g. More intimate experience, more relationship-building, more personal.
 - h. Franco at the photo area, he was super popular
 - i. Bubble wands and 'guns'
 - j. Music at certain areas (lot 10, lot 5, Alondra drop-off late add-on, photo area)
 - k. Clean up was fast
 - I. Creativity with car decoration by grads

2. Weaknesses:

- a. SARS RSVP glitches (Grad Fair & CARmencement)— take a long time to resolve, not responsive.
- b. Limited faculty involvement, especially in the afternoon session.
- c. More involvement by other departments, have other groups contribute to facilitation of event (day of)
- d. There were pockets of no cars driving though, possibly one lane could have accommodated the event. Most were on passenger's side.
- e. Families set off confetti guns early maybe more communication about what the day looks like, what happens at each station.
- f. More communication about grad images process that even if sit for picture, they are not obligated to buy.
- g. Ran out of M and L shirts
- h. General commencement emails were going to the graduation accommodations try to clarify on page what that email is for
- i. Accountability for staff/volunteers disappearing mid-shift, be sure to check in with lead
- j. In photo area folks were tripping over concrete dividers
- k. Markers on windshield were helpful but didn't translate to live stream well

3. Opportunities:

- a. Car parade or similar activity even when traditional ceremony held
- b. Have a photo opp area for traditional event
- c. Have identified break areas for staff/volunteer, if need to step away provide info where
- d. Promote decorating cars more
- e. Have student print out name and put it on front window Mt. SAC printed each name and handed it to the student when checked in

- a. Event was Friday before a long weekend
- b. The weather in the sun it was very hot

c. The wind (hedges fell over, and made balloon arches lower – and got stuck on at least one car. Cut arches by mid-afternoon).
