We, the Students of Cerritos College, to form a more perfect union, establish justice, ensure student opportunity, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the Associated Students of Cerritos College.

## ARTICLE I—LEGISLATIVE BRANCH

## Section 1—Legislative Powers

All Legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Senate.

## Section 2-Senatorial Oath

Before a Senator-elect enters the execution of their office, they shall take the following Oath or Affirmation: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the Associated Students against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office on which I am about to enter."

## Section 3-Membership

## Subsection 1

Members shall not continue serving in any capacity if their cumulative GPA falls below a 2.00 .

## Subsection 2

Senators must run for reelection every fall semester.

## Section 4-Senate Seats

The Senate shall have no less than twenty-six members as long as that many have run for the position of Senator in the previous election. If there are not that many, the President's appointments to the Senate shall not cause the number of Senators to exceed twenty-six. The addition of Senate seats shall be based on the overall growing student population as to be determined by a Joint Resolution with explicitly enumerated formulae, as long as there are enough Senate candidates at the time of the election for the expansion of membership.

## Section 5-Senate Positions

The Senate shall have its own officers. Officers include the President Pro Tempore, Clerk of the Senate, and the Sergeant-at-Arms.

## Section 6-Quorum

To conduct business, the Senate must meet a majority membership quorum. The quorum tabulation shall exclude the President of the Senate.

## Section 7-Compensation

Members may receive compensation for their services to Cerritos College, presumed their attendance does not exceed two unexcused absences.

## Section 8-Senate Authority

The Senate shall serve as the authority of its elections, returns, and qualifications of its membership under the Senate Rules.

## Section 9—Senate Record

The Senate shall keep a record of its meetings and shall publish it no later than three days after they are approved by a majority vote of the Senate, except in extreme cases where it is not possible to publish and disseminate the record in time.

## Section 10—Budget

## Subsection 1

The Senate shall be responsible for constructing, auditing, and approving the Budget of the Government.

Subsection 2
All legislation regarding revenue shall originate in the Senate.

## Section 11—Powers

## Subsection 1

The Senate shall have the enumerated powers.

## Subsection 2

The Senate shall establish the Cerritos College Student Activities fee.

## Subsection 3

The Senate shall issue subpoenas to further or gather knowledge for the Senate.

## Subsection 4

The Senate shall create laws for the Government.

## Subsection 5

The Senate shall establish regulations for the budget.

## Subsection 6

The Senate may approve any legislative proposals of the Associated Students from the College.

## Subsection 7

The Senate shall enact impeachment proceedings against the President, Vice President, and members of the Court.

## Subsection 8

The Senate shall approve any contracts with vendors or third-parties.

## Subsection 9

The Senate shall make all laws, which shall be necessary and proper, for carrying into execution the foregoing powers and all other powers vested by this Constitution.

## Subsection 10

The Senate shall not do the following: 1) It cannot pass a bill of attainder-one that punishes a Person or Group without a trial; and 2) Withdraw money from the Reserves, unless the Senate unanimously votes to do so.

## Section 12—Presidential Appointments

The Senate may approve any Presidential appointments with a majority vote.

## Section 13-Vetoing

## Subsection 1

Passed legislative proposals shall go to the President for approval before becoming law.

## Subsection 2

If the President does not sign and approve the bill, the President shall return the bill to the Senate with their objections. The Senate may reconsider the objections. If, after such reconsideration, two-thirds of the Senate shall agree to pass the bill, it shall become a law. In all cases, the votes of the Senate shall be determined by "yeas" and "nays," and the names of the Members voting for and against the bill shall be entered in the Record.

## Subsection 3

If any bill shall not be returned by the President within ten business days after it shall have been presented to them, the same shall be a law, in the same manner as if they had signed it, unless the Senate by their adjournment prevents its return, in which case it shall not be a law.

## ARTICLE II-EXECUTIVE BRANCH

## Section 1—The President

The Executive Power shall be vested in a President of the Associated Students of Cerritos College.

## Section 2-Vice President

The Vice President shall serve as the President of the Senate while the Senate is in Session.

## Section 3-Election

The President shall hold their office during the term of one year, and, together with the Vice President, be elected.

## Section 4—President's Oath

Before the President enters the execution of their office, they shall take the following Oath or Affirmation: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will faithfully execute the office of President of the Associated Students, and will to the best of my ability, preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of the Associated Students."

## Section 5-Vice President's Oath

Before the Vice President-Elect enters the execution their office, they shall take the following Oath or Affirmation: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the Associated Students against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance
to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office on which I am about to enter."

## Section 6 -Presidency

## Subsection 1

No Person, who shall not have attained the academic standing of a sophomore by the first full Semester of office and a cumulative 2.00 GPA as be eligible for the office of the President or Vice President.

## Subsection 2

Both the President and Vice President shall officially begin their term of office the first Monday following the last day of the Spring Semester.

## Subsection 3

In case of the removal of the President from office or of their death or resignation, the Vice President shall become President.

## Subsection 4

Whenever there is a vacancy in the office of the Vice President, the President shall nominate a Vice President, who shall take office upon confirmation by a two-thirds vote of the Senate.

## Subsection 5

Whenever the President transmits to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate a written declaration that they are unable to discharge the powers and duties of their office, and until they transmit to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate a written declaration to the contrary, such powers and duties shall be discharged by the Vice President as Acting President.

## Subsection 6

The Senate may, by law, provide for the Case of Removal, Death, Resignation or Inability, both of the President and Vice President, declaring what officer shall then act as President, and such officer shall act accordingly, until the disability be removed, or a President shall be elected.

## Section 7-Compensation

## Subsection 1

The President and Vice President shall receive compensation for their services to the College, which shall neither be increased nor diminished during their term in office.

## Subsection 2

Cabinet Members may receive compensation for their services to the College.

## Section 8-Appointment

## Subsection 1

The President shall have the Power, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate, to appoint Ambassadors, Judges of the Court, and all other officers of the Associated Students, whose Appointments are not otherwise provided for, and which shall be established by law.

## Subsection 2

The President shall have the power to fill any vacancies that may happen during the Senate Session by granting commissions, which shall expire at the end of their next Session.

## Section 9-The Cabinet

## Subsection 1

The President shall, with the Advice and Consent of the Senate, appoint department heads, known as the Cabinet.

## Subsection 2

The Members of the Cabinet shall serve no longer than the term of the President.

## Section 10—State of the Students

## Subsection 1

The President shall, from time-to-time, give to the Senate Information on the State of the Associated Students, and recommend to their consideration such measures as they shall judge necessary and expedient.

## Subsection 2

They may, on extraordinary occasions, convene both the Senate and Court. Concerning the Time of Adjournment, they may adjourn them to such time as they shall deem proper.

## Subsection 3

The State of the Students shall happen no less than once per academic year, with at minimum one event in the Spring semester of the given academic year, and shall be attended by both the President and Vice President during a time and date to be ratified via a Joint Law by both the Cabinet and Senate, unless it must be postponed due to unforeseen and unavoidable circumstances affecting the President, Vice President, or both, as to be accepted by a vote of the Justices of the Associated Students Court.

## Section 11-Impeachment

## Subsection 1

The President, Vice President, and all Appointed officers of the Associated Students, shall be removed from office on impeachment for, and conviction of, treason, bribery, or other high crimes and misdemeanors.

## Subsection 2

Articles of Impeachment shall be first drafted in the Senate by any member of the Legislative branch.

## Subsection 3

Thereafter, the Senate shall convict and remove the President from office, with the President Pro Tempore being the Presiding Officer.

## ARTICLE III—JUDICIAL BRANCH

## Section 1—Judicial Power

The Judicial Power of the Associated Students, shall be vested in a Court. The Judicial Power shall extend to all cases, in law and equity, arising under this Constitution, the laws of the Associated Students.

## Section 2—Jurisdiction

The Court shall have sole power to punish in all matters brought before the judiciary pertaining to the Associated Students Body, including expulsion from the Associated Students Body and any lesser measure.

## Section 3-Appointment

Justices shall carry an accumulative GPA of 2.00 at the time of their appointment.

## Section 4-Term Limit

Justices shall hold their offices during good behavior and while adhering to the laws of the Associated Students.

## Section 5-Positions

The Court shall have no more than one Chief Justice and eight Associate Justices.

## Section 6-Compensation

## Subsection 1

The Chief Justice shall receive compensation for their services to the College, which shall not be diminished during their continuance in office.

## Subsection 2

Associate Justices may receive compensation for their services to the College.

## Section 7-Public

The Court shall maintain a public docket.

## Section 8-Judicial Minutes

The Court shall, within three days, publish minutes after every Session or Meeting.

## ARTICLE IV—AMENDMENTS

## Section 1—Amendment Proposal

Whenever any Member of the Senate deems it necessary, they can propose Amendments to the Constitution via either a Senate Bill or Joint Law. The proposal can only be recommended to the Associated Students membership with a two-thirds vote.

## Section 2—Ratification

The proposed Amendment shall be ratified with a two-thirds vote of the dues paying members of the Associated Students in an election concurrent with the election of the Senators, unless the Senate unanimously votes to hold the election at a different time.

## AMENDMENT I (Ratified September 16, 2021) <br> Section I-Officer Oath

Any officer of the Associated Students shall take the following Oath or Affirmation before beginning their Service: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the Associated Students against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office on which I am about to enter."

## Section II—Chief Justice Oath

The Chief Justice of the Associated Students Court shall take the following Oath or Affirmation before beginning their Service: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will administer justice without respect to persons, and do equal right to the all diverse students, and that I will faithfully and impartially discharge and perform all the duties incumbent upon me as Chief Justice under the Constitution and laws of the Associated Students of Cerritos College; and that I will support and defend the Constitution of thereof against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; protect the rights of the students; their welfare and special interest; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office on which I am about to enter."

## Section III—Associate Justice Oath

Associate Justices of the Associated Students Court shall take the following Oath of Affirmation before beginning their service: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the Associated Students against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office on which I am about to enter."

## Section IV—Words Denoting Gender

Any masculine or feminine gendered language used in this document is hereby abrogated. Any pronouns used in this document shall be substituted with gender-neutral pronouns.

## Section V—Post-Meeting Published Materials

Any use of the word Journals, especially in regard to post-meeting published materials, shall be referred to as "minutes".

## Section VI—Repeal of Article I, Section 11, Subsection 4

Subsection 4 of Section 11 of Article 1 of the Associated Students Constitution is hereby repealed:
Subsection 4
The Senate shall constitute tribunals inferior to the Court.

## Section VII—Voting Procedure Regarding a Presidential Vice President Nomination

Subsection 4 of Section 6 of Article 2 of the Associated Students Constitution is hereby repealed and replaced with the following text: Whenever there is a vacancy in the office of the Vice President, the President shall nominate a Vice President, who shall take office upon confirmation by a two-thirds vote of the Senate.

## Subsection 4

Whenever there is a vacancy in the office of the Vice President, the President shall nominate a Vice President who shall take office upon confirmation by a majority vote of the Senate.

## AMENDMENT II (Ratified September 15, 2022)

Previous language prior to amendment shown below.

## Subsection 3 (no previous language, new section)

The State of the Students shall happen no less than once per academic year, with at minimum one event in the Spring semester of the given academic year, and shall be attended by both the President and Vice President during a time and date to be ratified via a Joint Law by both the Cabinet and Senate, unless it must be postponed due to unforeseen and unavoidable circumstances affecting the President, Vice President, or both, as to be accepted by a vote of the Justices of the Associated Students Court.

## Section 2-Ratification

The proposed Amendment shall be ratified with a two-thirds vote of the Associated Students membership in an election.

## Section 4-Senate Seats

The Senate shall have no less than twenty-six members. The addition of Senate seats shall be based on the overall growing student population.
