A BILL/RESOLUTION

Engineering Technology Club Funding for Spring 2026 **SB-2526-15**

Whereas: The Cerritos College Engineering Technology Club requires funding in the amount of \$8258.78 to attend the 2026 VEX U California League Competition at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo from January 17, 2026 to January 19, 2025. This funding will cover travel expenses, boarding, and meals for participating members, allowing them to gain valuable hands-on experience that they can apply both inside and outside the classroom.

Whereas: The Cerritos College Engineering Technology Club facilitates activities that prepare our members for university and private sector level electrical, electronic, software and mechanical engineering. This helps foster skills such as teamwork, communication, critical thinking, and design philosophy, which are essential for both academic and professional development.

Whereas: In addition to the academic benefits, attending competitions allows students to network with peers from other institutions, providing opportunities for collaboration and professional development in, not only robotics but related fields as well. We have strived for this so much to the point that the Cerritos College Engineering Technology Club's VEX U team was awarded the Judges' Award on three separate occasions from 2024-2025 competitions.

Whereas: The Cerritos College Engineering Technology Club requires funding to attend the 2026 VEX U California League Competition at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo from January 17, 2026 to January 19, 2026. This competition through VEX U is meant to engage university students around the world in the engineering design process and then compete against each other in specific objective games using the robots they design.

Whereas: The Engineering Technology team strives to represent Cerritos College at various competitions, promoting the school's name and contributing to its academic reputation. While also showcasing Cerritos College's diverse student body to colleges around the nations. Participation in these competitions enhances members' understanding of collective teamwork and strengthens the college's connections within the broader academic community.

Whereas: A total of 36 of our members will be attending this competition. Only the members that are a part of one of our competition teams (each containing 12 members) will be eligible to attend this trip. Any additional members who would like to attend the trip will be funding their travels without school aid.
