- New Course Numbers - Look for the "C" in the course number (e.g., ENGL C1000)
- New Subject Prefixes - Some subjects have updated abbreviations (e.g., POL → POLS)
- Same Courses, New Names - Course content remains the same—only the numbers and some titles have changed!
