Students are advised to complete ENGL 103 as their CSU GE Critical Thinking requirement. This will also meet a graduation requirement at CSULA as the prerequisite for their writing proficiency requirement.

Admissions will be first granted to qualified first time freshmen and upper division transfer applicants from the local admission area who file their applications during the initial admission application filing period. #### **University of California – Los Angeles**

Specific articulation for the major preparation is not available. The following are recommended preparation courses for the major. Exemptions from lower division requirements will be determined by the department after admissions. Applicants are considered on the basis of academic qualifications as well as departmental screening criteria.

#### **Art Option**

Students work in the following media: painting, drawing, sculpture, ceramics, new genres, and art theory. Preparation for the major: One course each in drawing, sculpture, painting, photography, ceramics, and new genres [performance art, video art, installation, and non-studio work]; four courses in art history, including one course covering each of the following art historical periods: 1850s-1920s, 1920s-1960s, 1960s-present. Exemptions from lower division requirements will be determined by the department after admission.

# **ASSIST**
