The one-hour, interactive training will teach you the 5D's of bystander intervention methodology: distract, delegate, document, delay, and direct; and how to prioritize your own safety while intervening. There will be time at the end for practice, and you'll leave feeling more confident intervening the next time you see anti-Asian/American harassment online or in person.
