## 1 AP 3560 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

The possession, sale or the furnishing of alcohol on campus and at functions of the District 5 is governed by California state law and these procedures. The possession, sale, 6 consumption or furnishing of alcohol is controlled by the California Department of Alcohol 7 and Beverage Control. However, the enforcement of alcohol laws on-campus is the 8 primary responsibility of the Campus Police Department. Possession and/or consumption 9 of alcoholic beverages is a violation of the Code of Student Conduct. The Office of 10 Student Conduct and Grievances administers the student due process and sanctioning 11 for student violations. The campus has been designated "Drug free" and only under 12 certain circumstances is the consumption of alcohol permitted. The possession, sale, 13 manufacture or distribution of any controlled substance is illegal under both state and 14 federal laws. Such laws are strictly enforced by the Campus Police Department. Violators 15 are subject to disciplinary action, criminal prosecution, fine and imprisonment. It is 16 unlawful to sell, furnish or provide alcohol to a person under the age of 21. 17 The possession of alcohol by anyone under 21 years of age in a public place or a place open 18 to the public is illegal. It is also a violation of this policy for anyone to consume or possess 19 alcohol in any public or private area of campus without prior District approval. 20 21 Organizations or groups violating alcohol or substance policies or laws may be subject to 22 sanctions by the District.

Alcoholic beverages on campus are permitted in a preapproved, designated area if:

- The alcoholic beverage is for use in connection with a course of instruction, sponsored dinner or meal demonstration given as part of a culinary arts program, and the instructor or individual has been authorized to acquire, possess, use, sell, or consume it by the President/Superintendent.
- Students 18 years of age or more taste, but do not swallow or consume, beer or
  wine for educational purposes as part of the instruction in an enology or brewing
  degree program, and the beer or wine remains in the control of the instructor.
- The alcoholic beverage is possessed, consumed, or sold, pursuant to a license or permit obtained for special events held at the facilities of the District during the special event. "Special event" means events that are held with the permission of the Board of Trustees that are festivals, shows, private parties, concerts, theatrical productions, and other events held on the premises of the District and for which the principal attendees are members of the general public or invited guests and not students of Cerritos College.
- The alcoholic beverage is for use during a fundraiser held to benefit a nonprofit

- corporation that has obtained a license under the Business and Professions Code
  to do so provided that no alcoholic beverage can be acquired, possessed or used
  at a football game or other athletic contest sponsored by the District.
- The alcoholic beverage is acquired, possessed, or consumed pursuant to a license
  or permit obtained for special events held at facilities of the District at a time when
  students are not on the grounds. "Facilities" includes, but are not limited to, office
  complexes, conference centers, or retreat facilities.
