5 **Course Repetition to Alleviate Substandard Academic Work**

6 A student may repeat a course in an effort to alleviate substandard academic work.

7 Students may repeat up to a total of two times in which substandard grades (less than

8 "C", including "FW" or "NP") were awarded, except in limited circumstances as described

9 below. Students do not need to petition for a first repeat of a course; for a second repeat

10 of a course, students must petition the Academic Records and Standards Committee for

11 approval.

12 If a student repeats a course that is not designated as repeatable and receives a

- 13 satisfactory grade, then the student may not repeat the course again except in limited 14 circumstances as described in the "Course Repetition Due to Special Circumstances" 15 section below.
- 16 If a student repeats the course and receives another substandard grade, the student may

repeat the course one additional time in an effort to alleviate substandard work. A student

18 may petition the Academic Records and Standards Committee to repeat a course for

19 which two substandard grades have been assigned, provided apportionment is not

claimed pursuant to Title 5 Section 58161. No more than two substandard grades may

be excluded in computing the student's GPA if the student repeats the class two or more

22 times.

If a student repeats a course to alleviate substandard academic work, grade and credit will be included when calculating a student's grade point average, as long as the student is not allowed additional repetitions for more than three semesters.

26 **Course Repetition Due to Special Circumstances**

27 Circumstances under which students may either repeat a course more than two times to

alleviate substandard grades or repeat courses in which a "C" or better grade was earned:

Student Accessibility Services: Students with disabilities who are registered with the College's Student Accessibility Services (SAS) department, can repeat a special class for students with disabilities any number of times when an individualized determination verifies that such repetition is required as a disability-related accommodation for the student for one of these reasons specified in Title 5, Section 56029:

- a. When continuing success of the student in other general and/or special classes is dependent on additional repetitions of a specific special class;
- b. When additional repetitions of a specific special class are essential to completing a student's preparation for enrollment into other regular or special classes; or
- 40c. When the student has a student educational contract which involves a goal41other than completion of the special class in question and repetition of the42course will further achievement of that goal.
- Military Service: A student who is a member of an active or reserve United States military service and who receives orders compelling a withdrawal from courses shall be permitted to withdraw upon verification of such orders. A withdrawal symbol of "MW" will be assigned on the student's transcript and the student receiving such a symbol shall be allowed to repeat.
- Occupational Work Experience: Students may repeat work-experience
 education. The grade received each time shall be included for purposes of
 calculating the student's grade point average.
- Legally Mandated Training Requirement: Students may repeat a course any number of times where it is required for a student to meet a legally mandated training requirement as a condition of continued volunteer or paid employment. Students can repeat such courses any number of times, regardless of whether the student recorded substandard work.
- **Employment or Licensing Requirement:** Students may petition to repeat a course needed for employment or licensure because of a significant change in industry or licensure standards. Students may take these courses any number of times.
- Significant Lapse of Time: A student may repeat a course in which a grade of
 "C" or better was received after a significant lapse of time (no less than 35 months
 since that grade was obtained), per AP 4228 titled Course Repetition Significant
 Lapse of Time.
- **Extenuating, Emergency, or Extraordinary Circumstances:** In cases where extenuating, emergency, or extraordinary circumstances exist, course repetition shall be allowed. Emergency conditions or extraordinary conditions are those meeting the requirements of Title 5 Section 58146 (b). Extenuating circumstances are verified cases of accidents, illness, or other circumstances beyond the control of the student.

70 **Repetition and Academic Records**

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51 Students are not permitted to retake classes in which a passing grade was already 52 earned. In the unlikely event that students enrolled and received a grade for a class in which they had previously earned a passing grade, the student will receive the highest ofthe two grades earned for GPA and credit.

Courses that are repeated shall be recorded on the student's permanent academic recordusing an appropriate annotation.

Annotating the permanent academic record shall be done in a manner so that all work remains legible, ensuring a true and complete academic history.

Students may use an equivalent course from an accredited college or university to replace a Cerritos College course in which a substandard grade was recorded, if earned subsequent to the substandard grade at Cerritos College. The student must petition the Academic Records and Standards Committee to record the change. The grade received will be calculated in the Cerritos GPA.

The College may honor the prior course repetition actions of other accredited colleges and universities in determining acceptance of credits, subject to student petition, and approval by, the Academic Records and Standards Committee.

Nothing can conflict with Education Code, Section 76224 pertaining to the finality of grades assigned by instructors, or with Title 5 or administrative procedures relating to retention and destruction of records.
