AP 4400 COMMUNITY EDUCATION SERVICES

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- Education Code, Sections 66010.4, 70902, 78300 et seq.;
- Title 5, Sections 55002 and 55160(b) 4
- The District's Community Education policy is based on the following standards against 5 which the program is structured and the Board will measure specific requests: 6
 - 1. Offerings are not-for-credit and designed to provide instruction and to contribute to the physical, mental, moral, economic, or civic development of the individuals or groups enrolled in them.
- 2. Offerings are established and maintained in civic, career and technical, literacy, 10 health, family and consumer sciences, and general education, including, but not 11 limited to, offerings in the fields of: music, drama, art, handicraft, science, literature, 12 aquatic sports, athletics, and career skills. 13
- 3. Offerings are open for the admission of adults and of those minors who may 14 benefit, in the judgment of the Board of Trustees. 15
- 4. Offerings are to provide educational services for all age groups, which utilize the 16 special skills and knowledge of the college staff and other experts and are 17 designed to meet the needs of the college District community at large.
- 5. Students enrolled in community education service offerings will be charged a fee 19 not to exceed the cost of maintaining the community education service offerings 20 21 and/or program.
- 6. Educational courses, cultural events, and recreational activities are to be developed 22 through advice from advisory committees, staff, and/or interested citizens. 23
- 7. General fund moneys are not expended to establish and maintain community 24 25 service offerings.
- Cerritos College through its comprehensive Community Education Program shall 26 endeavor to: 27
- 1) Become a center of community life by encouraging the use of college facilities and 28 services by community groups when such use does not interfere with the college's 29 regularly scheduled instructional and student programs. 30

- 2) Provide educational services for all age groups, which utilize the special skills and
- knowledge of the college staff and other experts and are designed to meet the needs
- of community groups and the college District community at large.

- 35 3) Contribute to and promote the cultural, intellectual, and social life of the college District community and the development of skills for the use of leisure time. (Discretionary
- 37 Education Code Section 78300)
- 38 Educational courses, cultural events, and recreational activities are to be developed
- through advice from staff, previous or current students, and interested citizens. Courses
- 40 being removed from college credit and noncredit offerings can be forwarded by the
- Curriculum Committee as to the feasibility of their becoming Community Education
- 42 courses.
- It shall be the responsibility of the manager of Community and Continuing Education to
- 44 maintain a current Manual on Policies and Procedures for the Community Education
- 45 Program.
