1 AP 4227 REPEATABLE COURSES

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Title 5, Sections 55040, 55041, 55253 and 56029

- 4 Only the following types of courses may be designated as repeatable:
 - Courses for which repetition is necessary to meet the major requirements of CSU or UC for completion of a bachelor's degree;
 - Intercollegiate athletics courses; and
 - Intercollegiate academic or vocational competition courses. Such courses may be repeated no more than four times for semester courses or six times for quarter courses.
- Under special circumstances, students may repeat courses in which a "C" or better grade
- 12 was earned.
- Students may repeat a course without petition when repetition is necessary to enable that
- student to meet a legally mandated training requirement as a condition of volunteer or
- continued paid employment. Students may repeat such courses any number of times.
- Students may petition to repeat a course as a result of a significant change in industry or
- 17 licensure standards such that repetition of the course is necessary for the student's
- employment or licensure. Students can repeat such courses any number of times.
- 19 The District shall identify and designate repeatable courses in the catalog.
- 20 Students may enroll in activity courses in physical education, visual arts, or performing
- 21 arts. Such courses may not be repeated for more than four semesters. This limit applies
- even if the student receives a substandard grade or "W" during one or more enrollment
- or if a student petitions for repetition for repetition due to extenuating circumstances.
- 24 Students with disabilities may repeat a special course for students with disabilities any
- 25 number of times when an individualized determination verifies that such repetition is
- required as a disability-related accommodation for the student for one of these reasons
- specified in Title 5, Section 56029:
 - a) When continuing success of the student in other general and/or special classes is dependent on additional repetitions of a specific special class;
 - b) When additional repetitions of a specific special class are essential to completing a student's preparation for enrollment into other regular or special classes; or

- c) When the student has a student educational contract which involves a goal other than completion of the special class in question and repetition of the course will further achievement of that goal.
- A student may repeat a cooperative work experience program any number of times as
- long as they do not exceed the limit on the number of units of cooperative work experience
- set forth in Title 5 Section 55253(a); however, the grade received by the student each
- time will be included in calculations of the student's grade point average.
- The District shall maintain the mechanism(s) necessary for proper monitoring of course
