8 The President/Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures for evaluating the 9 validity of a student's high school completion if the District or the United States 10 Department of Education has reason to believe that the high school diploma is not valid 11 or was not obtained from an entity that provides secondary school education.

12 Admissions Eligibility

The authority to oversee the admission of eligible students is delegated to the Dean of Enrollment Services under the direction of the Vice President of Student Services. Students eligible for regular admission to the College must be 18 years of age or older and possess a high school diploma, GED, certificate of proficiency or equivalent. In addition, any apprentice, as defined in Section 3077 of the Labor Code, or any other person who is over 18 years of age who, in the judgment of the District, is capable of profiting from the instruction offered at the College may be admitted.

20 **Residency**

21 Each person applying for admission or enrollment in a California Community College is

- 22 classified as a "resident" or "nonresident" for purposes of admission and/or tuition
- 23 calculation.
- **Resident –** a "resident" is a person who is eligible to establish California residency for
 tuition purposes or who has resided within California for at least one year and who
 established a legal residence in California prior to the residency determination date.
- Nonresident a "nonresident" student is one who has not resided in the state for
 more than one year prior to the residency determination date and who has not
 established legal residence or who is not eligible to establish California residency for
 tuition purposes.

31 Admission of International Students

- 32 The College accepts applications from students holding or attempting to obtain the F-1
- 33 Student Visa. The following items are required from international applicants:

- Completed International Student application and fee;
- High school transcripts, showing graduation, from an institution equivalent to an
 accredited U.S. high school or proof of 18 years of age minimum.
- For applicants whose native tongue is not English, the minimal score on the Test
 of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or an equivalent score on the Cerritos
 College Placement test or other standardized proficiency test before being
 admitted.
- Financial evidence (certified letter from a bank or detailed balance statement)
 verifying availability of fluid funds to meet all the student's educational and financial
 needs, accompanied if applicable, by a signed statement of support from the
 financial sponsor.
- Valid Passport.
- Transfer students from another domestic college or university only, copy of appropriate F-1 visa and/or I-94 form.
- Purchase, including by the student and all dependents, of international student medical insurance.

- 52 The College Catalog, which is updated annually, contains the most recent information 53 regarding admissions.
