- Under Department of Homeland Security regulations, Cerritos College is authorized to enroll students on F-1 visa for the A.A. degree, transfer programs, and certificates, including intensive English. To be considered for admission, an international student must complete the following required application packet items available in the Office of International Student Services:
 - International Student application and fee;
 - Proof of high school, secondary, college and or university graduation (transcripts or Diploma) equivalent to an accredited U.S. high school; or in accordance with AP 5010 titled Admissions and Dual Enrollment policy, any apprentice, as defined in Section 3077 of the Labor Code, or in the absence of these, any other person who is over 18 years of age who, in the judgment of the District, is capable of profiting from the instruction offered at the College may be admitted;
 - All applicants whose native language is not English must meet the minimal score on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or an equivalent score on the Cerritos College self-reporting tool or other standardized proficiency test before being admitted to an academic/undergraduate degree program;
 - Financial evidence (certified letter from a bank or detailed balance statement) verifying availability of fluid funds to meet all the student's educational and financial needs, accompanied if applicable, by a signed statement of support from the financial sponsor
 - Appropriate F-1 visa and I-94 form are required for all students transferring from another domestic college or university;
 - A valid passport is required for all applicants
 - Purchase, including by the student and all dependents, of international student medical insurance upon admission;
 - Upon admission, the F-1 student is issued the SEVIS I-20 and is required to adhere to all federal regulations regarding their immigration status. The Office of International Student Services will report required events into the SEVIS program as mandated by United States Citizenship and Immigration Service (USCIS).

- The calculation of nonresident tuition fee applicable to noncitizens who have not or cannot
- establish residence, shall result in an amount not to exceed the amount expended by the
- 40 District for capital outlay in the preceding fiscal year divided by the total full-time
- equivalent students. This fee cannot exceed 50 percent of the nonresident tuition charged
- 42 other nonresidents.
