7 Nursing students who have already earned a baccalaureate or higher degree from a
8 regionally accredited institution of higher learning are not required to complete any
9 general education requirements that may be required for an associate degree. Instead,
10 these students only need to complete the coursework necessary for licensing as a
11 registered nurse.

12 The District will recruit students from low socioeconomic populations to enroll in the
13 District's nursing program.

14 The District shall utilize published criteria when screening students for admission to the
15 nursing program including:

- 16 • Academic degrees or diplomas, or relevant certificates, held by the applicant;
- 17 • Grade point average in relevant coursework;
- 18 • Life experiences or special circumstances of an applicant;
- 19 • Any relevant work or volunteer experience; and
- 20 • Proficiency or advanced level coursework in languages other than English
