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- The District will recruit students from low socioeconomic populations to enroll in the
- 13 District's nursing program.
- The District shall utilize published criteria when screening students for admission to the
- 15 nursing program including:
  - Academic degrees or diplomas, or relevant certificates, held by the applicant;
- Grade point average in relevant coursework;
  - Life experiences or special circumstances of an applicant;
- Any relevant work or volunteer experience; and
- Proficiency or advanced level coursework in languages other than English
