14 presentation on Guided Pathways  
15 from Rick Miranda, our Vice  
16 President of Academic Affairs.

17 >> Rick Miranda: Good  
18 evening. Thank you. I would  
19 like to take a few minutes to  
20 present the California Guided  
21 Pathways. This is an initiative  
22 being brought forward from the  
23 Chancellor's Office that we be  
24 taking a part of. Over the  
25 upcoming months I will be happy

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1 to return and give you an  
2 update. I will be presenting  
3 just about a quarter of what the  
4 initiative is asking for at this  
5 point and time. It's pretty  
6 in-depth. I know you could  
7 follow it today but it would  
8 take a long time and let me  
9 bring it in pieces and do it  
10 over time. With that California  
11 Guided Pathways you will notice  
12 the other individuals down there  
13 Sonya Christian and Craig  
14 Howard. They're the President  
15 of Bakersfield and RP Group and  
16 a compilation of slides plus our  
17 own. I would like to thank  
18 David Fabbish in back who is my  
19 spear point on this and I  
20 appreciate his great support as  
21 well would like to publicly  
22 thank him as well, so what is a  
23 guide? Well, a pathway is a  
24 series of classes that lead to a  
25 degree, certificate, some other

1 academic benchmark. It's a  
2 curriculum. Okay. So it's a  
3 combination of compilation of  
4 courses and locally maybe an ADT  
5 degree or certificate of  
6 achievement, some of the  
7 terminology that we use here  
8 often. Guided Pathways support  
9 by policies, practices and  
10 services. These policies help  
11 students enter paths here on  
12 campus, stay on the path, reach  
13 their academic goals and  
14 ultimately move on and that move  
15 on is to matriculate to a four  
16 years or to the work force.  
17 Now, the Guided Pathways has  
18 four clear pillars to it. And  
19 it will require us to clarify  
20 the path for our students.  
21 Define how they enter this path.  
22 How do we help them stay on the  
23 path? And along with our fine  
24 faculty have always done ensure  
25 the learning that will continue

1 that way as well, so what I am  
2 going to do today is really  
3 speak about clarifying the path.  
4 Okay. I will bringing the  
5 others as we develop more  
6 policies and the student  
7 services and I the outreach and  
8 how we all play a role in this.  
9 Now this is a typical college  
10 offering. We call this a  
11 cafeteria style college pacts  
12 are unclear and in take and  
13 bring them on board and divert  
14 students from competing.  
15 Student's progress is not  
16 monitored or not monitored well.  
17 Our systems aren't in place to  
18 monitor it well. Learning  
19 outcomes are not assessed across  
20 programs. Now our faculty do a  
21 fantastic job on student  
22 outcomes but this is a general  
23 statement across the state want  
24 what is it equal in the end?

25 They're churning around in the

1 institutions and not completing  
2 in a timely manner and leaves to  
3 frustration and leave ahead of  
4 time and go to another system in  
5 in some cases it's most costly  
6 for them and not well defined so  
7 they turn elsewhere. Completion  
8 is down and whether a  
9 certificate or a degree or skill  
10 building courses they take back  
11 to the work force. Often they  
12 end up with excess credits.  
13 Time to degree to finish  
14 increases and skill building  
15 down. This is not a typical up  
16 and down the state. We have  
17 done a tremendous job here at  
18 Cerritos College working towards  
19 these goals already and we will  
20 continue to build upon them with  
21 support of the Guided Pathways  
22 and the funding sources as well.  
23 Now, the Guided Pathways college

24 -- this is what it looks like.

25 Okay. Clear road maps to

1 student goals. Intake redesign

2 as an on ramp so clear on.

3 Ramping. Student progress

4 closely tracked. Learning

5 outcomes assessments aligned

6 across programs. Well, you know

7 the obvious story here and leads

8 to decrease in transfer and

9 completing and leaving with

10 complete diagnose or packages

11 that allow them to successfully

12 transfer. Completion is up.

13 Excess credits down. Time to

14 degree down so transfer

15 velocity, skill building up so

16 this is the goal. This is the

17 -- dare I say the gauntlet that

18 was dropped before us to help

19 our students and this is what we

20 will be attempting and not only

21 attempting -- we put in place

22 and implementing and be  
23 successful in as a college  
24 endeavor and transformative  
25 approach and not as a single

1 constituent group but working  
2 together for our students. What  
3 does it look like? I did this  
4 with other ventures and with my  
5 colleagues in the state. In  
6 short I think it's simple to  
7 rather define a pathway. I  
8 experience this pathway when I  
9 was a student. I was a  
10 community college student as  
11 well and went to Fullerton and  
12 the catalog semester one two,  
13 three, four and clearly defined  
14 and they helped me move.  
15 Somewhere in the late 90's this  
16 practice fell away up and down  
17 the state and more courses were  
18 in there, a lot more exploration  
19 for the students when is  
20 important but for today's

21 students it's not clear the  
22 pathway should be taking and be  
23 successful in so it's a approach  
24 to go back and revisit but this  
25 require so much more from us

1 now. Okay. The high touch, the  
2 student services, everybody's  
3 role in this is going to be  
4 amped up a bit so we can be a  
5 complete service -- or student  
6 oriented and student success  
7 oriented campus. We have been  
8 but there are other practices  
9 out there that we can employ  
10 that we have the opportunity to  
11 employ so you see a first  
12 semester. Here's are courses  
13 laid out. Second semester,  
14 third semester. These are the  
15 major courses. The General Ed  
16 courses are needed to be  
17 discussed and counseling advises  
18 but this will allow our students



19 to have a little more mole and  
20 understanding of what they're  
21 doing and keep themselves on  
22 track which is important as  
23 well. Okay. We're here to help  
24 them in all their endeavors.  
25 What is the specific course

1 sequence look like? Well,  
2 funnel students into a broad  
3 area of interest and I will talk  
4 about this this a moment want  
5 how do we have 23,000 students  
6 declare what their interest are?  
7 That's a challenge. Okay. So  
8 we will have to define some  
9 general areas to help funnel  
10 them in a direction that would  
11 allow to start the GE pathway,  
12 dare I say survey courses that  
13 leads to the specific program  
14 later but it's a clear pathway.  
15 So I mentioned number two,  
16 recommend General Ed and elected  
17 courses. Advise students what

18 they should be taking and  
19 provide the courses to student  
20 when is they need them. That  
21 comes back to the enrollment  
22 management plan and efficient  
23 scheduling as well. Okay. Now  
24 what is this grouping they  
25 mentioned in the last one, the

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1 path ways. Some call it meta  
2 and some call it buckets and  
3 essentially the health sciences  
4 and imagine you're a student and  
5 opening the catalog and could be  
6 daunting. This is the first  
7 time to college. You haven't  
8 had the opportunity yet to meet  
9 the counseling staff and work  
10 with them but you're perusing  
11 the catalog and what am I going  
12 to do? How am I going to do  
13 this? You can imagine website  
14 that helps direct this and helps  
15 you in the direction and again

16 David Fabbish started the  
17 website for the campus and I  
18 will share it next time and have  
19 talks where we're at. Have a  
20 message board as we have the  
21 plans we're putting in and talk  
22 about them and I again thank  
23 David for the work on this. The  
24 health sciences are broad. You  
25 can come in as a nursing major,

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1 physical therapy assistant,  
2 child development. All of these  
3 so our students can click and  
4 all right what does it take  
5 for me to be this person, this  
6 type of student with this  
7 career? And then it moves  
8 through public safety, business,  
9 agriculture, STEM, social,  
10 behavior and so on. This is not  
11 specific to our campus. This is  
12 a model that is out there we  
13 could brand for ourselves and  
14 define who we are maybe based on

15 academic division in many ways.  
16 That might be our initial on  
17 boarding for students to direct  
18 them in what manner but this is  
19 just an example. Okay. There  
20 is also career and personal  
21 exploration as well for the CFE  
22 track. I don't mean to say that  
23 last because it's not an  
24 afterthought. CTE was  
25 considered career training and

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1 going to work but it's not just  
2 that today. It's academic  
3 endeavors as well. Yes, you  
4 could take a few courses and  
5 move you through in a short  
6 series of classes and the work  
7 force but often leads to four  
8 year degrees as well so they're  
9 there and that is important to  
10 consider. Okay. So let me tell  
11 you a little bit of what the  
12 state is putting behind this

13 effort. Okay. \$150 million for  
14 community colleges to  
15 participate. All right. The  
16 project aspires to transform  
17 community colleges L that's a  
18 term I used earlier,  
19 transformative. This is what  
20 we're going to do. We're going  
21 to change for the better how we  
22 help our students and help guide  
23 them and keep them on the path  
24 and provide the services so they  
25 can be successful. Now, this is

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1 the timeline in which we have to  
2 follow, and there are key things  
3 that we have to do in this  
4 timeline. I won't go into all  
5 of the details of the timeline  
6 but you can see as you see the  
7 orange there and through the  
8 months and that's where we're at  
9 and the Chancellor's Office  
10 accepts Guided Pathways for  
11 acceptance. If you go back to

12 multi-year plans and meetings.  
13 There are points in time  
14 throughout this academic year  
15 that we will have to provide  
16 information to the Chancellor's  
17 Office to be eligible -- okay.  
18 To be eligible for our -- for  
19 our portion of the \$150 million.  
20 Okay. So I will talk a little  
21 bit about that more in a moment.  
22 Now, our portion and it is a  
23 calculation set by the  
24 Chancellor's Office is 2.4  
25 million. That's what we're

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1 eligible. I keep using that  
2 word. It won't be less. It  
3 won't be more, but there are  
4 some criteria we have to meet to  
5 be eligible for this money, but  
6 I will get to that again. This  
7 money is dispersed over five  
8 years. We would be distributed  
9 these amounts for the years as

10 listed and about a quarter  
11 million in the preceding years.  
12 Every year is clear about what  
13 the expectations are as well.  
14 Development of the plan in year  
15 one. Implementation of the plan  
16 in year two. It's important to  
17 take a look at this. Year one  
18 and year two. We're not in year  
19 one quite yet and we're working  
20 in that direction. It allows  
21 time for groups to come  
22 together, all of us, the campus  
23 to continue to have  
24 conversations and how we're  
25 going to -- well, change the

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1 face of Cerritos College in some  
2 ways. Bring forward some of the  
3 best practices. Build on some  
4 of the practices that need to  
5 have light shined on them as  
6 well that are not known it to be  
7 best but they're there and exist  
8 already and the plan and

9 assessment and refinement of the  
10 plan. Now, how do we do this?  
11 Well establish transparent cross  
12 functional work teams. We have  
13 to work together. We can't  
14 change the campus. We cannot  
15 build for our students without  
16 including all voices on campus.  
17 Okay. Faculty have to speak  
18 amongst themselves have tough  
19 conversations at times because  
20 the Guided Pathways -- clear  
21 pathways. What course end up on  
22 a pathway? They're hard  
23 conversations but they're  
24 important. How do we support  
25 them? Classified staff are

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1 behind every one of the courses.  
2 We have to know if we develop a  
3 pathway can do to and supported  
4 it as well? The faculty will  
5 help you find this and the Deans  
6 and we and you help the policy



7 as well so general areas of  
8 interest. We have to define on  
9 ramps. Okay. Sorry. We have  
10 to have an information campaign.  
11 We have to have branding. It's  
12 important to tell you know the  
13 world who we are and what we can  
14 provide because we have done a  
15 lot of great things and we need  
16 to continue to get our name out  
17 there. Development of pathway  
18 maps and templates. Okay.  
19 Create students if groups. What  
20 do the students need? What are  
21 they asking for? What are the  
22 feeds? How do we tie this to  
23 the labor markets as well?  
24 These are all important issues  
25 and of course we need to track.

1 How do we ensure they're keeping  
2 on the pathway that we're not  
3 losing them as they go or walk  
4 down? so that includes tracking  
5 system and early alert systems.

6 Many of these things currently  
7 will reside both within the  
8 integrated plan for the basic  
9 skills initiatives and some of  
10 the tracking system for 3SP and  
11 this will be a collaborative  
12 effort with many of our other  
13 initiatives and programs. So it  
14 will be a synthesis really of  
15 all of our programs together and  
16 it's important okay. Now, so  
17 what needs to be done to receive  
18 our portion? Well, we have to  
19 attend a workshop. Check.  
20 Done. We did this. A group of  
21 seven attended the workshop in  
22 September. Complete a self  
23 assessment. Well, it's in  
24 progress. The assessment -- all  
25 the data has been collected.

13 will submit a work plan. Well,  
14 the guidelines aren't yet  
15 provided. This is due in March  
16 though so we turn in the self  
17 assessment December 23. We  
18 receive the guidelines from the  
19 Chancellor's Office as well and  
20 we start working on the  
21 guidelines. What is our basic  
22 five year plan? And submit that  
23 by March 30. Okay. This is  
24 what is required to receive the  
25 funds. Okay. It's not a

1 judgment of what we put but it's  
2 a requirement where we have to

3 reflect and then ask ourselves  
4 where are we at so we can  
5 develop a clear plan that is  
6 achievable, measurable as we  
7 move forward so this is where  
8 we're at at this point. Self

10 worry up and down I will tell  
11 you on the work plan. The work  
12 plan was supposed to be released  
13 from the Chancellor's Office  
14 about three weeks ago. As of  
15 late yesterday I received word  
16 from one of our regional CIO  
17 reps with the state it will be  
18 released soon so we're still  
19 waiting on that, so but with no  
20 date yet so David there is your  
21 answer. Okay. Now, this idea  
22 of Guided Pathways is not new to  
23 the nation. What we have here  
24 are some schools who have  
25 already clear pathways build and

3 looks like and how do other  
4 schools do it so that's there to  
5 look at but as you realize every  
6 system is a little bit

11 assuming they have already  
12 completed their English  
13 requirements. Those are my  
14 comments. Thank you.  
15 >> You have two questions  
16 intake and the remedial. Let me  
17 address the remedial portion  
18 first. In my mind it's a  
19 timeline and I will speak to the  
20 Multiple Measures approach. I  
21 think with the legislation of  
22 705 that remedial approach will  
23 be addressed and is worked on  
24 and discussed with the Multiple

2 looking at GPA from the high  
3 school as one of the indicators

5 example, I am using math you  
6 know up and down the state

12 starting three levels below so

11 Measure G was approved the

12 voters approved authorization up

13 to \$350 million. Since then in

14 2014 a \$100 million was issued

15 on that authorization leaving a

16 remaining \$250 million left.

17 Right now we are requesting an

18 issuance of \$75 million to

19 continue our construction

20 projects that we have going on.

21 We have just about tapped out

22 all of our funds at this moment.  
23 We're down to about 1% left of  
24 the \$100 million left which is  
25 great. We're able to spend down

Sample footer

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1 our monies. 85% -- some of the  
2 tax certificate requirements  
3 districts to spend down 85% of  
4 the funds within the first three  
5 years so we accomplished that so  
6 we're requesting another  
7 \$75 million to continue a number  
8 of our projects going on. I  
9 also have with me representative  
10 from Morgan Stanley who is our  
11 investment underwriter banker to  
12 assist to go through the heights  
13 of the bonds we're issuing,  
14 length of time. One of the  
15 things I always wanted to point  
16 out on this particular issuance  
17 is compliance AB182 and set in  
18 January 2016 required districts  
19 to ensure their debt repayment  
20 ratio was lower than four to one

21 ratio. As you see right now  
22 we're estimating ours to be 1.52  
23 at this moment. Obviously once  
24 we finalize the sale of the  
25 bonds things could you know

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1 increase or decrease on it, but  
2 as based on what the market  
3 rates are currently this is  
4 actually a very, very good debt  
5 repayment issue. Anywhere  
6 between two -- two to one ratio  
7 is good to get to nearly one and

21 the sale. So the structure of  
22 our bonds is we can conservative  
23 structure means we are leaving  
24 capacity for future issuances  
25 but also looking advantage of

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1 current interest rate to look in  
2 a low cost for the district and  
3 the constituents so we're  
4 looking at what current interest  
5 bonds and the traditional  
6 vanilla conservative type of  
7 General Obligation Bond issued  
8 by school districts with voter  
9 authorization and we have  
10 assumed a 4% assessed valuation  
11 so that is one of the components  
12 that goes into structuring and  
13 capacity for future transactions  
14 so that is below the district's  
15 historical level so we think  
16 that is a conservative estimate.  
17 We're looking at a 25 year term

18 for the sale so we analyze  
19 typically a 25 to 30 year term  
20 and we think the district is  
21 beneficiary of strong growth  
22 since the authorization was  
23 approved allowed us to shorten  
24 up the term by a few years and  
25 by doing that we reduce the cost

2 overall cost to the taxpayers  
3 but still leave ample capacity  
4 for the rest of the program to  
5 be issued going forward and  
6 accommodating any fluctuations  
7 and market conditions and  
8 assessed value growth so that's

10 issuing so this chart is give  
11 you an idea of the overall plan  
12 for the election of 2012  
13 authorization, so the bars are  
14 colored by the series of bonds  
15 that have been issued and will



16 be issued going forward. The  
17 blue bars are series A so the  
18 first sale that has taken place  
19 and B is the orange bars we're  
20 planning to sell and you will  
21 notice that we leave plenty of  
22 capacity under the \$25 tax rate  
23 for further ash sentences to be  
24 accommodated -- issue issuances  
25 going forward and this will take

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1 the district through half of the  
2 authorization leaving  
3 \$175 million to be issued in the  
4 future and looking at the mart  
5 conditions we find ourselves in  
6 an advantageous position with

4 25 term versus a 30 year term of

10 analyzing a Bond Program so if  
11 you think about a bond financing  
12 like a home loan. Generally the

13 lodger you borrow and the longer  
14 you take to repay it the longer  
15 interest rate but paying  
16 interest for a longer period of  
17 time so by shortening from 30 to  
18 25 years we're able to pay down  
19 the debt faster and therefore  
20 lower your interest cost over  
21 the life of the transaction. It  
22 makes sense to do that when you  
23 have capacity under your tax  
24 rates and given the conservative  
25 assumptions on the last sale and

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1 also what we see going forward  
2 we think that the district is in  
3 a position to take advantage of  
4 that shorter term and still have  
5 plenty of flexibility going  
6 forward under the tax rate  
7 limitations.  
8 >> One of the things I want to  
9 touch base the law requires us  
10 to actually extend a maximum of  
11 30 years but one of the things

12 that -- one of the questions I  
13 brought up is I wanted to you  
14 know that exact same thing. I  
15 wanted to entertain the ability  
16 to actually shorten down to 25  
17 years because knowing the cost  
18 benefits overall, knowing that  
19 we just went to San Francisco  
20 about two weeks ago to actually  
21 get our credit rating. We  
22 currently don't have it yet. We  
23 actually have a draft from one  
24 of the particular vendors, S&P  
25 and we're still waiting and get

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1 a draft of the report tomorrow  
2 from Moody's as well which plays  
3 in the part of the  
4 attractiveness of our bonds once  
5 they go to market but one of the  
6 things we wanted to ensure based  
7 on making sure that we're  
8 complying with sound debt

10 evaluate the 25 versus 30 and  
11 then knowing our capacity I felt  
12 that we were in a position to  
13 actually go ahead and go with  
14 the 25 which is not you know  
15 typical. Usually you know 30  
16 year is a more looked upon  
17 because it provides a lot more  
18 flexibility for you in the  
19 future in case your growth  
20 doesn't pan out the way it's  
21 supposed to. However looking at  
22 our history for even going back

4 and five yeases and two absences.  
5 The Board of Trustees approved a  
6 settlement with case of 6855127  
7 to authorize the Vice President  
8 of Resources Superintendent to  
9 sign the agreement. The vote  
10 was five yes, absent two. This  
11 ends the close session and we  
12 adjourn in memory of  
13 Ms. Edwards. Thank you.
