

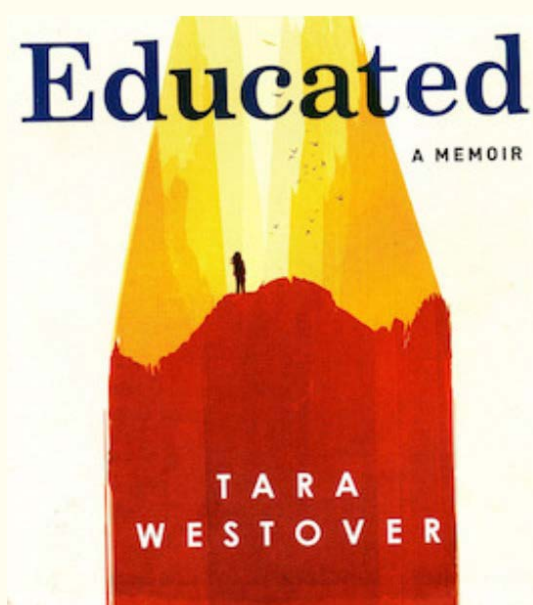

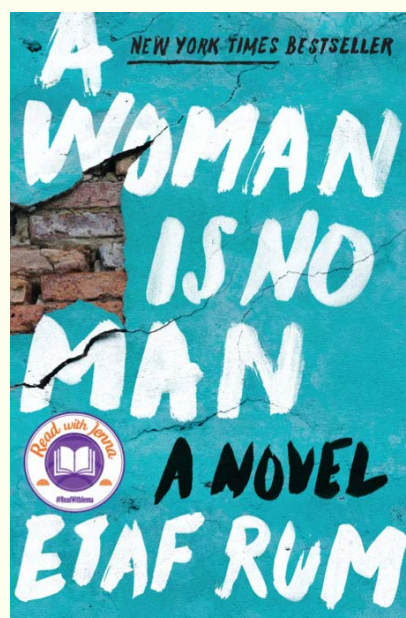
Who is this for? Students, faculty, staff, and managers (flex credit offered!).

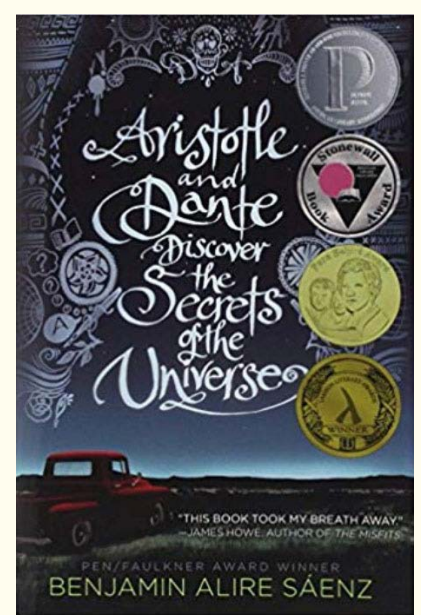
