Hiroshi Motomura is the Susan Westerberg Prager Distinguished Professor of Law and Faculty Co-Director of the Center for Immigration Law and Policy (CILP) at the UCLA School of Law. He is the author of *Immigration Outside the Law* (Oxford 2014), *Americans in Waiting* (Oxford 2006), and he is the co-author of *Immigration and Citizenship: Process and Policy* (West 9th ed. 2021). He has received several university teaching awards and is one of 26 U.S. law professors profiled in *What the Best Law Teachers Do* (Harvard 2013). Hiroshi has testified in Congress, and he currently serves as a Nonresident Scholar of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace and as a member of the International Migration Review editorial board. He was awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship and a Rockefeller Foundation Bellagio Residency to write his latest book, *Borders and Belonging: Toward a Fair Immigration Policy*, published in January 2025 by Oxford University Press. He is also featured in the Try Guys video, *The Try Guys Try Immigrating to America*.
