*Five Years North* is an award-winning PBS documentary providing a deeply personal look at the U.S. immigration system. The film is the coming-of-age story of Luis, an undocumented Guatemalan boy who just arrived in New York City, as he struggles to work, study, and evade Judy – the Cuban-American ICE officer patrolling his neighborhood. As their two worlds near a collision, the parallel tales present a complex and humanizing portrait of immigration and civic duty.
