## Resolution in Support of Faculty Primacy on Teaching Modality

**Whereas,** The Academic Senate for California Community Colleges is empowered by Title 5 §53206 with regard to representing local academic senates from California community colleges statewide in the formation of state policies on academic and professional matters;

**Whereas,** in Spring 2021, the ASCCC passed Resolution 09.03 *Asserting Faculty Primacy on Teaching Modality* proclaiming:

- Teaching modality, whether face-to-face, partially online hybrid, synchronous online, or asynchronous online, is directly connected to the faculty purview established under Title 5 §53200, particularly curriculum and instruction development, pedagogical and andragogical preparation, and student success.
- Under Title 5 §53200, the modality in which a course is offered is firmly within faculty purview.

**Whereas,** the Administration created a new teaching modality to be used starting FA21 which originally did not go through the Faculty Senate;

**Whereas,** historically, the teaching modality in which a class is offered is determined by department faculty when the assignment schedule is constructed;

**Whereas,** offering a different teaching modality may be necessary to accommodate departmental and/or program needs;

**Whereas,** there have been recent instances in which the teaching modality of a scheduled class was changed without consent or consultation with the affected instructor; and,

**Whereas,** there have been recent instances in which Instructional Deans have pressured chairs to change an already scheduled teaching modality.

**Be it Resolved** the Cerritos College Faculty Senate:

- 1. Affirms the teaching modality of a course offered at Cerritos College is firmly within faculty purview.
- 2. Affirms the creation or modification of teaching modalities must primarily be approved by the Faculty Senate.
- 3. Asserts that any changes to a scheduled teaching modality before the start of the term must only occur after collegial consultation with the affected instructor.
- 4. Asserts that any changes to a scheduled teaching modality after the start of the term must first be approved by the affected instructor.
