MINUTES: The minutes from February 11th Faculty Professional Development Committee (FPDC) has been tabled to the next meeting.

AGENDA ITEMS:

- 1. Introductions/Welcomed new members
- Chad informed the committee that the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) Visiting Team Identified Center for Teaching Excellence (CTX) as an "Exemplary Program."
 - a. Visiting Team Chair Dr. Kathleen Rose called the CTX "a perfect place, a perfect place" for their base of operations at Cerritos College.
 - b. Dr. Rose also specifically complimented Monique Valencia for her work with the visiting team.
 - c. During subsequent report to Faculty Senate, CTX Coordinator Chad Greene credited FPDC members for their efforts to revise the sections of the Institutional Self-Evaluation Report (ISER) related to the CTX and FPDC to better reflect the work we do.
- 3. Statistics on Faculty Professional Development for 2019-20
 - a. As of last week, faculty have had 128 professional development opportunities throughout campus. Those represent a total of 227 hours of potential flex credit.



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- 4. The committee discussed one-time funds for Professional-Development opportunities for offcampus.
 - a. Chad informed the committee that the college added some funds to this year's budget for the CTX to pay for off-campus professional-development opportunities for faculty.
 - b. Our goal is to select opportunities that align with existing strands of professional development on our campus (such as AB 705, accessibility, equity/culturally responsive teaching and learning, and online teaching and learning).
 - c. We are currently considering the following events for full-time and part-time faculty:
 - i. California Great Teachers Seminar (Faculty Association of California Community Colleges) 5 x \$1,500 = \$7,500 (plus mileage reimbursements)
 - Reading Apprenticeship 101 (Strategic Literacy Initiative at WestEd) 10 x \$750 = \$7,500
 - Equity 101 (California Community Colleges' Success Network) 10 x \$175 = \$1,750
 - iv. Equity and Culturally Responsive Teaching in the Online Learning Environment (Online Network of Educators) – 10 x \$85 = \$850
 - v. Creating Accessible Course Content (Online Network of Educators) 10 x \$85 = \$850
 - d. The committee suggested to offer opportunities on Campus Safety (Active shooter scenario) and a Technology-Base conference for online learning.
- 5. Chad notified the members that the targeted date to replace *Flex Reporter* with *Cornerstone* is now targeted for December 2020.
 - a. *Cornerstone* has been licensed by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCC) for the entire system; has been implemented by 32 community colleges already and is being implemented by 21 more by end of this semester.
 - b. Would allow us to integrate with the CCCCO's Vision Resource Center, enabling our faculty and staff to take their online trainings and for us to track that participation.
 - c. Because they are currently replacing their HRIS, our colleagues in Human Resources have requested that we wait to join implementation Cohort 4 starting around August and ending with integration around December.
 - d. We have negotiated an extension of *Flex Reporter* through December with the developer.
- 6. The committee did not discussed the selected events for the committee members to promote.

- 7. Items from the Floor



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- a. Chad shared the *Emergency Guide for Faculty* in the event of campus closure due to COVID-19 outbreak. This guide will define what it means to teach online, alternative options for teaching online, and resources for faculty.
 - i. Faculty must contain regular contact with their students. Administration would prefer faculty to use Canvas and Confer Zoom.
 - ii. If the course cannot transition to online, arrangements must be made to makeup hours at a different time. Students must complete a minimum number of hours to receive credit for a class.
