The meeting of October 10, 2008 was brought to order at 9:20 a.m.

MINUTES OF September 12, 2008

It was moved by Bernie Negrete, and seconded by Dean Mellas, to approve the Minutes of September 12 as presented. The minutes were approved with two abstentions (Mike Salazar and Erik Duane). There were no corrections or discussion.

OUTSTANDING IT STANDARDS ISSUES

Lee mentioned that we are looking into the DC7900, which is the potential replacement for our current standard of the DC7800. Lee has been working with HP on the detailed specification and she has scheduled HP to provide the committee with an update so we can discuss the details of the changes to the standard desktop computer and have an opportunity to ask questions. No additional standards issues were brought forward.

HP's PRESENTATION and DISCUSSION

HP attended the IT standards committee meeting and presented information on their new DC7900 desktop PC, notebooks, and other details. Their presentation included some of the following highlights:

- DC7900 Desktop PC
 - 21-24 month lifecycle
 - 85% efficient power supply (Energy star 4 compliant)
 - Contains a "Display Port" digital connection for a monitor connection option (version 1.1)
 - Optional SATA port for high speed data transfer to external storage
 - 2 PCI Express (x16), 1 PCI Express (x1), 3 PCI full height slots
 - Additional security features
 - File sanitizer
 - Privacy Manager
- HP announced continued support of MS Windows XP operating system until 2010 (maybe even longer)
- Web sites that contained good downloads and information were shared for better PC management:

Lee provided a handout with the part numbers and specifications and presented the details and pricing for the DC7900 to the committee:

This is the approximate configuration and some components may vary slightly. This particular system will be available in the mid October timeframe. Cerritos College price is **\$859.00**

Lee pointed out some suggested changes:

1. We increase the hard drive from 80 to 160GB
2. Select the E4800 Intel core 2 duo processor (or better)
3. Discontinue the 2nd DVD drive and just use the one DVD burner

With the above suggested changes, the price will drop \$20. per PC (from \$879. down to \$859).

The committee members had discussions regarding various topics, including the following:

- Details around the new “Display Port” video option and how that might drive a change to our current monitor standard
- PS/2 keyboard & mouse options vs. USB
- Various case options (should we consider a smaller case) and the pro’s and con’s including pricing
- Optional SATA port vs. USB external drives

Lee will move forward firming up pricing and details to ensure a smooth transition from the DC7800 to the DC7900, which will be discontinued by the end of the calendar year.

HP also presented details about their notebook lines and monitor lines of equipment. Kevin Kim and Mike McMahon from HP provided the presentation. Kevin is our account manager and Mike is a solutions architect and provides engineering support.

OTHER ITEMS

No other items were discussed.
