Students will be trained in psychosocial rehabilitation and recovery paradigm. The recovery based training program was established at Cerritos College to meet a need in the community for well trained mental health professionals.

Employment of behavioral disorder and mental health counselors is projected to grow 23 percent from 2016 to 2026, much faster than the average for all occupations. Employment growth is expected as people continue to seek mental health counseling services. In addition, there will be a continued need for counselors to work with military veterans to provide them the appropriate mental health care.
