K-16 Bridge to College Students and Dr. Fierro

Access + Completion = Student Success

Cerritos Complete aims to boost student completion through smooth transition from high school to degree attainment.

Cerritos Complete is Cerritos College's new student success initiative that focuses on student's pledge to "earn and complete their degree or certification on time." In exchange, the College will provide up to **800** students from local high schools with a merit-based scholarship for a tuition waiver or a **\$200** book voucher for one year.



Through its **K-16 Bridge to College Program** the Cerritos Complete students at ABC, Bellflower, Downey, Norwalk-La Mirada, and Paramount Unified School Districts have a clear path to college. Students in K-16 Bridge receive assistance in completing the college **Early Success Program (ESP)**, a Summer Connection course, counseling appointments, career exploration assistance, workshops and a personalized schedule for their first two semesters.

Another new program to support students through completing their degrees is **Accelerated Instruction in Math and English (AIME)**. AIME is designed to help accelerate students' ability to complete their remedial and college-level math and English courses faster.

While early access to higher education is critical to student success, the College's focus on students actually completing their degree or certificate remains a top priority.

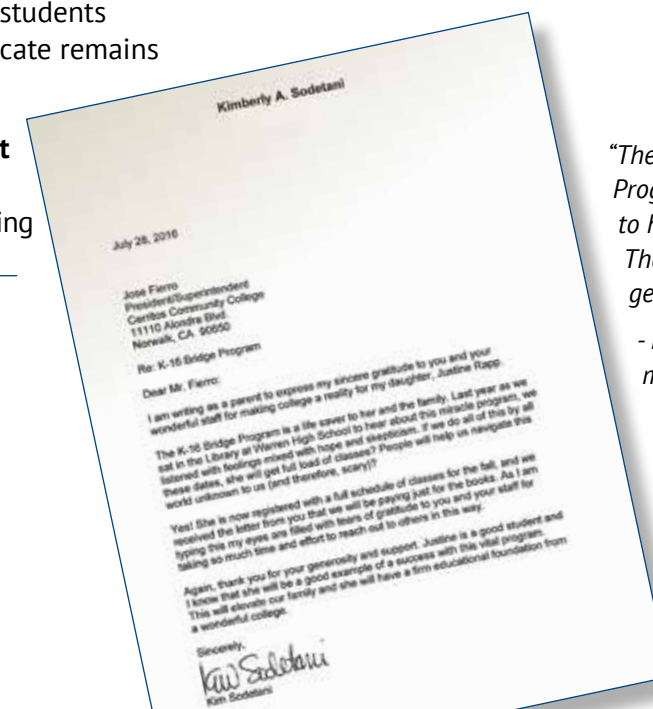
The campus also unveiled its new **Finish First** program to support students who are only one class away from graduating or completing

a certificate. Students receive assistance through priority enrollment, financial assistance for either enrollment fees or vouchers for books, and supplies to complete their degree or certificate program.

Dual Enrollment

More than **560** high school students are set to earn college credit while in high school through new articulation agreements this fall at Cerritos College. The College signed 50 new articulation agreements through its Project Lead the Way program with several unified school districts that will allow qualified high school students to earn up to 12 units of college credit in engineering related courses while in high school.

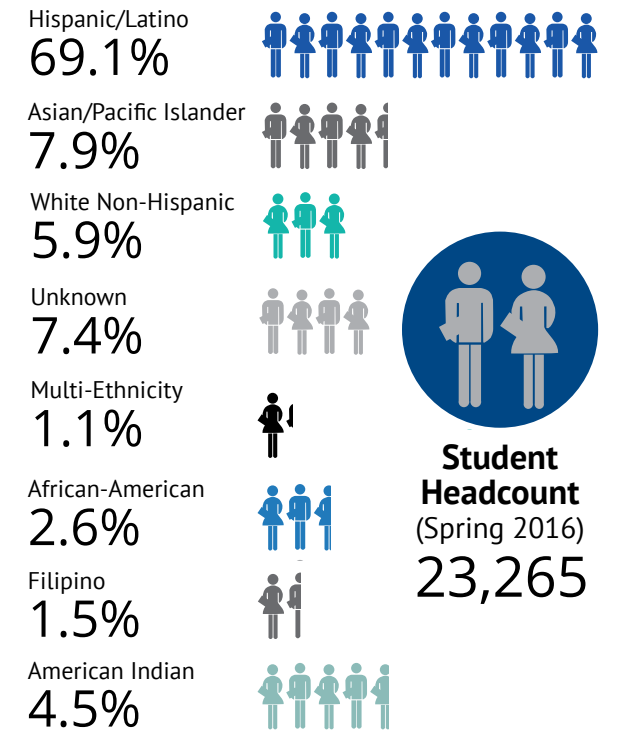

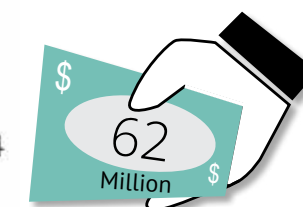

Alejandra Carranza, a Cerritos College honors student, was named one of the nation's top scholars by the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship Program.

Alejandra was among 75 students chosen from a competitive nationwide pool. The scholarship – one of the most competitive undergraduate transfer scholarships in the nation – provides Alejandra with up to \$40,000 per year to complete a bachelor's degree.

She plans to continue her undergraduate research at UCLA in neuroscience, and further her study to complete an MD/Ph.D. program to combine her passion for research and desire to work with patients as a physician or surgeon.

Student Newspaper and Radio Station Honored

Cerritos College student Samantha Dawson was named a 2016 Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team Gold Scholar. The Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation sponsors the Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team program by recognizing 50 Gold, 50 Silver and 50 Bronze Scholars, and providing nearly \$200,000 in scholarships annually. Each Gold Scholar receives a \$1,500 scholarship and a special medallion.

Samantha, a single mother majoring in geography and minoring in physics, was also selected for All-USA Scholarship's California First Academic Team.

Samantha plans on pursuing her education in geography and physics at California State University, Dominguez Hills. She participated in the NASA/California Space Grant Consortium microcomputer and robotics internship in 2015, and she hopes to become a scientist and work at NASA.



Cerritos College's *Talon Marks* student newspaper team won awards at the annual Journalism Association of Community Colleges (JACC) state conference in April. The conference was attended by nearly 500 students and faculty from community colleges throughout California.

Mathematics/Computer Information Science and Fine Arts Buildings Signal More Growth at Cerritos College

With anticipated opening in spring 2017, the new Math/CIS Building and Fine Arts building will be dynamic complexes that enhance the student learning environment in many ways. The new Math/CIS Building will be an important bridge to the future for the next generation of scientists, health professionals and STEM educators. The Fine Arts Building will provide rich education to future artists and communications professionals who will take active roles in tomorrow's creative and cultural arenas.

Mathematics/Computer Information Science Building

(Measure CC) Project Cost: \$19,128,000

The 33,000-square-foot facility will be located adjacent to the Fine Arts Building. The facility will be a two-story, steel structure building. The first floor will support math faculty, classrooms, and a study center. The second floor will support computer information labs, classrooms, and a second study center. Construction began in January 2015 and is expected to be completed in January 2017.

Fine Arts Building

(Measure G) Project Cost: \$29,128,000

The new 55,000-square-foot Fine Arts Building is in full construction. The first floor will support faculty, and includes a general lecture room, printmaking, ceramics, film, and an art gallery. The second floor will feature painting/drawing, computer graphics, photography, and mass communication classes. This project is expected to be completed in January 2017.



COMPLETED PROJECTS

Learning Resource Center Modernization

(Measure G) Project Cost: \$7,200,000

Modernization of the Library Resource Center included revitalizing the student success center, the math learning center, modern language lab, and a study lounge space. This renovation provides a modern learning environment with improved lighting, computer work stations, quieter testing rooms, and major building infrastructure improvements. Construction began in January 2015, and the project was completed in August.

Student Services Relocations

(Measure CC) Project Cost: \$2,160,000

To improve the student experience and efficiencies, several areas of Student Services were relocated and modernized. Assessment, Career Services, Financial Aid, Counseling and the Admissions and Records departments were all updated to better serve the students.



Your Bond Dollars at Work

Thanks to voter-approved funds from Measure CC (2004) and Measure G (2012), Cerritos College is undergoing a campus transformation that will upgrade the College with modern facilities and resources. Cerritos College is committed to developing the best student learning environment that is energy efficient and sustainable.

Landscape (Partially funded by Measure CC)
Project Cost: \$1,160,000

The frontage roads of Alondra and Studebaker had a complete renovation with new water efficient landscaping and walkway improvements. This project is partially funded by state funds for landscape remediation to provide water conservation measures and drought tolerant landscape plants. The impacted area totals over 30,000 square feet, and provides storm water retention, new landscaping, irrigation, decorative fencing and enhanced driveway entries.

Green Cerritos Update

Cerritos College is an environmental leader. The District is dedicated to adhering to sustainability practices and policies that conserve the planet's diminishing natural resources. The District is creating a campus environment that fosters sustainability through conscious decision-making strategies and Green facilities that meet the U.S. Green Building Council's LEED® standards in: energy efficiency, alternative energy, waste management, transportation, water conservation, instructional programs, and greenhouse gas emissions.

Water Conservation

In the midst of California's historic drought, Cerritos College is taking steps to reduce its water use:

- In 2016, the College added drought-tolerant and low-water use plants to the landscape along Alondra Ave. and Studebaker Blvd.
- Over **95 percent** of the campus' landscape and athletic fields are maintained with re-claimed water. The College saves more than **30 million** gallons of potable water annually. This is equivalent to saving the same amount of water that **185 families of four** would use for one year.

Energy Savings Measures

- Cerritos College received more than **\$895,000** in utility incentives from 2006-2015 and significantly reduced its electrical and natural gas consumption.
- In 2012, Governor Brown set goals to make the state's buildings greener. Since then, the College has secured over **\$1.5 million** in state funding to retrofit lights to LED and fine tune mechanical systems on buildings.
- The College reduced electrical consumption by over **1 million kilowatts**, which is equivalent to the annual electrical consumption of **166 average homes**. The College also reduced its natural gas use by 38,000 therms, (equal to the natural gas use of 70 households for one year) saving the College more than **\$200,000**.
- The Health & Wellness Complex will be the College's first LEED® certified building. Construction will begin December 2016.

Greenhouse Gas Reductions

- In April 2014, the College installed eight Electric Vehicle Charging (EVC) stations that have reduced greenhouse gas emissions by 11,254 kilograms, which is roughly equal to the energy used by one home per year. Vehicles charge for \$0.32 cents per kilowatt hour.
- The Associated Students of Cerritos College championed the campus's nine new water stations that allow users to refill their bottles with fresh drinking water, thus reducing the number of plastic bottles from landfills. As of July 1, 2016, these stations have eliminated the use of 171,000 plastic bottles.

Campus Prepares for Emergency Response with Active Shooter Training Drill and New Safety Features

As part of its ongoing commitment to campus safety, Cerritos College conducted a large-scale active shooter response training in June. The Cerritos College Campus Police Department, L.A. County Sheriff's Department's Norwalk Station, L.A. County Fire Department, and local first-responder agencies collaborated for months to put together the safety exercise that included two simulated active shooter scenarios staged on campus. The exercise also involved student volunteer "victims" and a surveillance helicopter.

"This exercise helps prepare the law enforcement and first responder agencies in the event of a large-scale emergency on the Cerritos College campus. The College will be participating in additional emergency response activities, drills, and training to ensure that the campus community is fully aware of our emergency procedures," said the Cerritos College Chief of Police Tom Gallivan.



Safety is a top priority at the College. Several safety measures have been added, including a new blue light phone system across campus that allows callers to reach Campus Police with just one push. (See page 12-13 for more information)

The College also hosted a series of safety forums, and increased its law enforcement presence around campus, among other measures.



Cerritos College Professor Wins American Inhouse Design Award

Bonnie Barrett, professor of graphic design and computer graphics at Cerritos College, won the Graphic Design USA (GDUSA) American Inhouse Design Award for her 2015 Cerritos College Faculty and Student Art Exhibit catalog design. Cerritos College is the only community college in the region that produces a full catalog for faculty and student art exhibits.

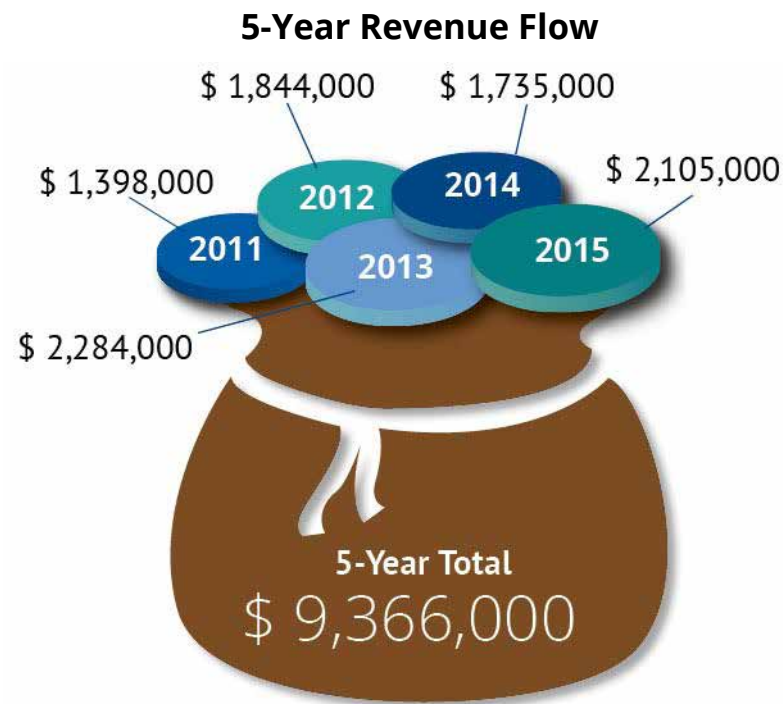

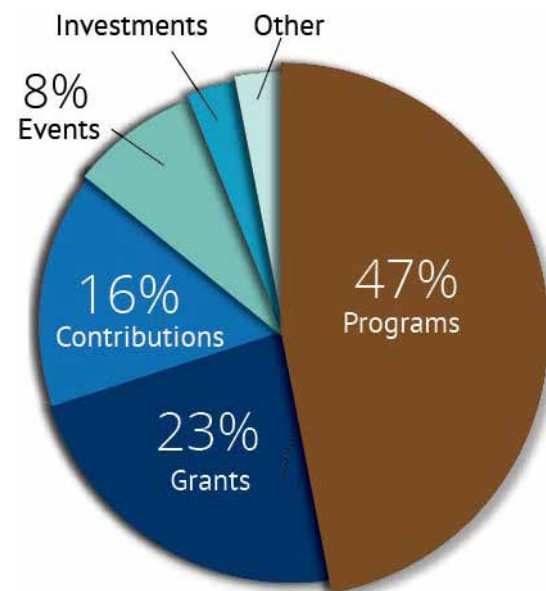

In 2015-16, the Foundation gave over **\$1 million** in support of programs at Cerritos College.

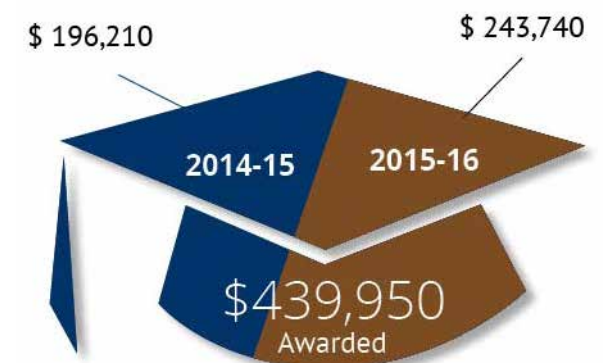

Grants and Donations

Cerritos College received \$1,572,942 from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office's Strong Workforce Task Force to strengthen the College's career technical education (CTE) programs to meet regional labor market needs. The Chancellor's grant will provide funding for the College to partner with the Southeast Los Angeles County Workforce Investment Board (SELACO WIB) to align its CTE programs with regional and industry needs and prepare students for jobs needed within the regional labor market.



Cerritos College's **Automotive Import Technician Training Program** received a **new 2016 Q3** donated by **Audi of America**. The College also signed an agreement with Audi of America to join the Audi Education Partnership Program, which aims to attract skilled technicians to Audi dealerships. Under the program, Audi will provide the College with technical information, web-based training, vehicles, tools, and equipment all related to Audi brand products to support student training.

The Automotive Import Technician Training Program also received **eight engines** donated by **Subaru of America** in summer. The 2.0 turbo engines from the 2015 WRX will be used for valuable hands-on training. The car company has been a long-time supporter of Cerritos College. It also donated scholarship funds for auto students in 2010 and 2012, a high performance engine from the 2009 film *Fast and Furious 4* in 2011, and nine engines in 2015. Cerritos College is part of Subaru's new education partnership program Subaru-U that prepare students for possible future employment at Subaru retailers nationwide.



Earlier this year, the College received a **\$25,000 donation** from the **Gene Haas Foundation** to support scholarships for students enrolled in its **Machine Tool Technology** program. Glenn Cheshire, district manager, Haas Factory Outlet (Torrance, CA) presented a check to Nick Real, Ed.D., instructional dean of the Technology Division at Cerritos College. Beginning this semester, students who have completed 10 units in the Machine Tool Technology department with a grade of C or better will receive a \$200 scholarship toward purchasing books or tools.

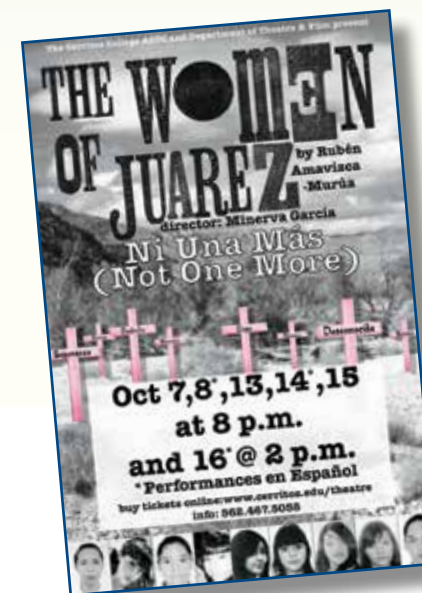
