



- Anticipate needing to hire minimum of 2 Full Time faculty members plus number of positions vacated through retirement



Cerritos College Faculty Demographics: AGE




65 & Older = 25 faculty members

Cerritos College Faculty Demographics: ETHNICITY





Cerritos College Faculty Demographics: ETHNICITY

Full-time, part time ratio (FTEF= full time equivalent faculty).

Academic Affairs working on the data with IT

- 75/25 cannot be achieved in each department/program; overall college goal
- Zero-Sum gain in hiring for 2016-17
 - FT hires will reduce PT sections offered
 - Consider FT hiring impact on faculty overload
 - Enrollment in decline; part-time sections risk reduction which will affect FT/PT ratio

How the indicators converge:

Balance: not all Divisions/Programs can achieve 75/25 ratio

- ONE COLLEGE: many disciplines and departments!

High WSCH/FTES is necessary to off set smaller WSCH/FTES programs

- Goal of 18,000 FTES for 2015-16
- Wherever possible, the state WSCH target of 525 should be goal
- Credits and class size impact WSCH generation

Succession Planning:

- 21 faculty members (65+ years old)
- 82 faculty members (55-64 years old)
- Retirees: April paperwork deadline and then counted into following year FON

Keep in mind: Sustainable processes (hiring/review/etc. 4 year process to tenure)
