As we serve on selection committees, review applications, and conduct interviews, I hope we can all take a moment to recognize our Human Resources employees who are managing an incredible workload during this semester. Not only is the HR office responsible for the day-to-day functions (such as onboarding, compliance, risk management, benefits, annual evaluations, leaves of absence, accommodations, staff development...just to name a few!)— this semester, the HR office has completed no less than 13 recruitments, with 36 more currently underway. The numbers continue to grow. The search is well underway for a VP of Human Resources, with campus-wide forums scheduled for May 23 and May 24. Working together with the entire Student Services area, we recognized an immediate need to fill the VP of Student Services position for the fall semester. The job announcement for VPSS was posted on April 15 and will be open through May 29. Campus-wide forums for the VP of Student Services are tentatively scheduled for July 18 and July 19. While change can be difficult, it is an opportunity to look at where we are, what have accomplished so far, and what we want to continue to achieve as a campus. I would like to thank everyone who commits to these selection processes across campus. Your feedback and expertise are incredibly valuable. ASCC Campus-Wide Efforts

This year's group of student leaders continue to go above and beyond in their roles, and I am impressed by their professionalism and tenacity. Earlier this month, I had the honor of attending a panel at the ASCC Leadership Retreat, where one of the things that we talked about was how representation is important. We were able to share personal stories about how we started out on our journeys to becoming leaders. I shared that when I arrived in the United States, I did not speak any English, and it was fun to be able to talk with our students about some of the challenges that I experienced as I began on my career path that led me to where I am today. I hope they enjoyed the conversations as much as I did.

This month, our **student leaders** also hosted the college's first State of Students event, where the entire campus had an opportunity to hear directly from our students about data on student involvement and resolutions passed. I hope that we can continue this event on an annual basis.

In addition, earlier this week I stopped by the Earth Day event where our students encouraged individuals to sign the Break Free from Plastic Pledge. Cerritos College was the first community college in California to sign on to the campaign, whose goals are simple but ambitious:

1. Establish a purchasing policy that eliminates campus and food vendor procurement of all non-essential, non-compostable, single-use disposable plastics. The goal is to keep accessibility and affordability at the forefront of decision-making to ensure that accommodations are made for all users of the system

2. Commit to monitoring plastic-free alternatives in future procurement decisions and policies regarding items that cannot currently be eliminated due to a lack of viable alternatives

3. Invest in education, resources, and infrastructure to assist in the Plastic-Free Campus transition

I want to emphasize that this effort was **initiated entirely by students**. We are excited to work together to accomplish the goals of the campaign.
