
Our student learning environment continues to improve and expand through the use of Measure G construction funds.




Student Profile: Ethnicity




Student Profile: Age




EEO and Diversity Plan



- Undocumented Student Week of Action: October 15-19
- Statewide week of advocacy and activities to support and build awareness about undocumented students
- Activities included free immigration consultation, workshops, fundraising event, resource fair, and webinars.

Student Success Center

- 90,384+ repeat student visits to the Success Center
- 112,515+ hours logged Yearly investment of 1,7 Million dollars
- Each visit increases a student's chances of passing his or her class



 Finish Great is a campaign to raise \$12 million toward scholarships, student career training, and economic development




Campaign Money Raised to Date

Economic Impact in the Region

- Taxpayers see a return on their investment
- 14.3% internal rate of return on investments in community colleges
- For every \$1 of public money spent on community colleges, taxpayers receive a cumulative return of \$6.80 over the course of a student's life through higher tax receipts and public sector savings

Economic Impact in the Region – Return on Investment



- High earning potential at an affordable price
- For every \$1 a Cerritos College student spends on their education, they see a return of investment of \$3.80 - \$6.80
- Graduates in average earn \$58,500 by mid-career
- Nearly 60% of Cerritos College alumni think their work is a high-meaning job, contributing to making the world a better place

Bond Construction

- Our student learning environment continues to improve through the use of Measure G construction funds
- Current and upcoming projects emphasize state-of-the-art facilities, sustainable features, and outdoor shared spaces for studying and learning

Current Construction: Performing Arts Center

- Approximately 70,000 square feet
- Includes a 400-seat state-of-the-art theatre and smaller black box performance area
- Will house the Music Department's instructional labs, lecture halls, band rooms and practice rooms




Current Construction: Health and Wellness Center



- Designed to meet the criteria for LEED (Leadership in Energy Efficiency and Design) certification
